THIRTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME A 15 NOVEMBER 2020

Dear friends,

The master said, "Well done, good and faithful servant; you have shown you can be faithful in small things, I will trust you with greater; come and join in your master's happiness" (Matthew 25:14-30). In this parable, Jesus tells us of the importance of recognising the talents and opportunities given to us and using them for the benefit of people and to the glory of God. This is developed in a continuing passages from St Matthew that we will have next Sunday as we celebrate the Feast of Christ the King. On that feast, Christ is presented as the King who will return again to judge the living and the dead, and we will be judged by him according to our sharing and caring for other in the course of our life. The talents and opportunities he has given us are not just for ourselves by to give glory to God by serving others.

Our first reading today from Proverbs 31 speaks of "The perfect wife" who is busy and industrious and brings joy to her husband and family. Her charity and love is not limited to her own home or family for "She holds out her hand to the poor, and opens her arms to the needy". In this time of the pandemic it has been a stressful and testing time in terms of outreach and close involvement with others. There is a keep your distance mind-set which affects relationships in families as well as good friendships. People who live in different homes and especially in care homes have to keep distance, though for a good purpose, and the joy of meeting and being in touch with each other is diminished and even taken away.

Speaking personally, I have found this time of lockdown a limitation of outreach to people since the end of March. Our hearts go out to people that we, and I as a priest, have been unable to visit or attend to for the past seven months. The candle I placed on our altar at the beginning of the lockdown, I see as being deeply symbolic, for it represents our people being placed before Christ on the Cross. He is the "Suffering Servant" whose hands are reaching out to us from his Cross as a compassionate Saviour who is with us in our trials. Whilst each of us has our own particular calling or vocation, talents and opportunities, it has been difficult that we cannot be in touch with people we have always ministered to or visited. How we use our talents, for better or worse, in the course of our life is or a question we all have to face. We hope it will be wisely and generously, and that our Master and Lord and will judge us kindly and say to us, "Come and join in your Master's happiness" in heaven.

May God bless and protect you, your families and loved ones at this time. Fr John

I am very sorry to tell you that due to the latest Covid regulations and lockdown we are yet again not permitted to celebrate Mass with people present. As happened earlier in the year I will celebrate Mass in church daily and pray for the protection of our people.

Our parishioner Shea Lolin, has set up a youtube channel to stream Mass live from our church. On Sunday, 8 November, we streamed Remembrance Sunday Mass at 11am offered for all who died on in the Two Great Wars and subsequent conflicts. We will **continue** to live stream the Sunday 11am Mass from our church during the present lockdown in the churches. The links to join in are in the instructions overleaf.

We hope to be able to resolve the technical difficulties in connecting to the broadband in the Parish Office, so that it may be possible to continue the streaming when we have people back in Church for Mass, at the beginning of December – we hope! We would welcome any ideas or skills people may have to address these problems, so that it can be done safely and there is no danger of tripping up on wires.

We hope that the new heating system will be installed in our church, on the week beginning the 23^{rd} of November. Due to the nature of our building, it will still be fan assisted but should be much quieter and more efficient than the present system. Some of the present units are now obsolete and beyond repair as the necessary parts are not available.

It is sad that the lockdown or "lockout" in church is with us again. However, people are welcome to our church for private prayer or to light a candle. If you wish to gain entry to the church at a (*reasonable!*) time, please ring the bell at the side door of the Priest's House and Sacristy and if at home, I will be happy to let you in to the church.
