OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST THE KING YOUTH SUNDAY 22 Nov. 2020

Dear friends,

Jesus said "When the Son of Man come in his glory, escorted by all the angels, then he will take his seat on his throne of glory" (Matt.25:31-46). As we come to the end of the liturgical year, the Church directs our thoughts to the end of the world, when Christ's work of saving people and nations will be completed. He will return to judge the living and the dead and separate one from another, for his judgement will be true, since he is Truth. In his presence, no one will be able to manipulate or cover up the truth about their thoughts, words or actions, for all people will realise their need for God's mercy to save them from condemnation.

Ezekiel (34:11-17) shows a compassionate and merciful God wanting to heal the wounded, strengthen the weak and save people, especially the scattered. He will and is still a Good Shepherd and Saviour, even for those who do not recognise or have faith in him. By grace, which is his gift to us, we are able to turn to him, and ask him to save us from our sins and being lost. By his grace we are saved through faith, and delivered from condemnation to share in his glory.

When Christ comes to judge us, he will focus on how we expressed our love of God in terms of practical love and care for other people. Those who are the weakest and most vulnerable are the people who have the first and greatest claim on our love, and the way we treat them is the way we treat Christ himself. Do we love the hungry, homeless and impoverished; do we welcome refugees, asylum seekers and strangers; do we care for the sick, the vulnerable and those in prison? Christ will judge favourably and welcome into his kingdom those who show compassion, love and care for others and say to them, "as long as you did it to one of the least of these my brothers and sisters, you did it to me".

Today is Youth Sunday, and it is necessary for us to support young people in their faith journey through life, so that they will see Christ accompanying them, as a friend and brother. He will lead and guide them to be compassionate, caring and sharing, especially with and for those in need. We have many images of Christ, that help us understand his relationship with us, but one of the most helpful is the line of the hymn, "Hail Redeemer, King divine", which says "King most holy, King of truth, guide the lowly, guide the youth; Christ thou King of glory bright, be to us eternal light".

May Christ, our King, give us the grace to worship and serve him. Fr John

The new heating system is to be installed in our church this coming week, beginning the 23rd November. Due to the nature of our building, it will still be fan assisted but should be much quieter and more efficient than the present system. Some of the present units are obsolete and now beyond repair as the necessary parts are not available.
