FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT Year B

29 November 2020

Dear friends,

Jesus said "Stay awake, because you do not know when the master is coming" (Mark 13:33-37). The word "Advent" means "coming" and in the four weeks of this short season of Advent we prepare for the coming of God as man, in the person of Jesus, at Christmas. One of our Advent hymns says: "The coming of our God, our thoughts must now employ; then let us meet him on the road with songs of holy joy". For Christians, the coming of God in the person of Jesus, is the fulfilment of Old Testament prophecies, especially those of Isaiah. When we talk about preparing for Christmas, i.e. Christ's-Mass, we often think of cards, shopping, presents, food and the material things we engage with in this season. But our spiritual preparation is also most important for us as Christians.

The opening prayer in today's Mass says: "Almighty God, we pray, grant to your faithful people, the resolve to run forth to meet Christ with righteous deeds, so that at his coming we may be gathered at his right hand, and be worthy to possess the heavenly kingdom". We can all recall positives and negatives in our life. We can give thanks to God for the good we do, for the right relationships we choose and live by, and for the ability to have an outgoing love and care for others. On the other hand, it is important for us in this holy season, to recognise that there are aspects of our life which we need to bring to the Lord for healing and forgiveness. The times we should have been focused on God's will and others rather than ourselves. Times we should have been disciplined and made sacrifices for the cause of right - in our thoughts, words and actions. In recalling some of these aspects of our life we bring them to the Lord, the author of healing, and ask him to grant us forgiveness and cleansing from all that makes us unworthy of our calling as Christians and children of God, our loving Father.

The first Sunday of Advent is the beginning of the new Liturgical and Christian year. At a new year we look back on what has gone before and this year has been like none other that we have known. Aspects of life that we have taken for granted have been thrown into uncertainty and there is the insecurity that comes from being cut-off and self-isolating and that has affected many of our people. We use the expression "in the hands of God", so we should turn to him and ask him touch us with the invisible hands of Jesus, our Saviour. His hands reach out to us from the Cross and show us that he bears our wounds and hurts, and raises us up with himself to God, our Father. *May God bless and protect you. Fr John*

After the latest changes to Covid regulations, we will happily celebrate Mass again, with people starting next Saturday, 5 December, at 6pm. During lockdown I celebrated Mass daily to pray for the protection of our people.

Our parishioner Shea Lolin, has set up a youtube channel to stream Mass live from our church. Having spent many hours to eliminate interference that affected the sound, he has now been successful. We have live streamed 11am Mass from our church on the weekends of 8th, 15th & 22nd November. We will **continue** to live stream the Sunday 11am Mass from our church, this Sunday and on subsequent Sundays, provided we have people to help operate the system. Links to join in the Mass are in the instructions overleaf.

We still have some technical difficulties connecting with the broadband in the Parish Office, but intend to continue the streaming the Sunday 11am Mass when people are back in Church. We would welcome any ideas or technical skills people may have to offer to address these problems, so that it can be done safely and there is no danger of people tripping up on wires.

The new heating system is now being installed in our church and should be completed in the coming week. Due to the nature of our building, it will still be fan assisted but should be much quieter and more efficient than the present system. Some of the present units were obsolete and beyond repair as the necessary parts are not available – hence the need for a new system!
