What do I want for Christmas?

How many times each year are we asked what we would like for Christmas? How many times each year do we ask others what they would like to receive? It's a good and often asked question, but what is a good, sincere Christian reply?

When I was young, my thoughts centred around what my 'Christmas Stocking' would contain. Almost certainly an apple and an orange and possibly a tube of fruit pastilles and some 'Jelly Babies'. My parents would usually have something like a toy or a box-game of some sort to give to my brother and me – which we would share. We never had the opportunity to ask for something for ourselves – that was never an option!

How times have changed!! From long before 'Black Friday' each year, the expectations of many people, including both the young and some of more mature years, reflect the affluence of our society generally and, in many households, the cry of 'I would like, please' has given way to a loud 'I want'.

The 5pm deadline for booking will allow time for you to make alternative arrangements to attend weekend Mass elsewhere if necessary, and for people to come to Mass in our church when we are limited in the numbers we can accommodate.
