THE HOLY FAMILY: JESUS, MARY & JOSEPH 27 December 2020

Dear friends,

"When the day came for them to be purified, as laid down by the law of Moses, the parents of Jesus took him up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord" (Luke 2:22-40). Today as we celebrate the feast of the Holy Family of Nazareth, we think not only of the problems and difficulties they faced but also the stresses and challenges many families face in our time. This past year with the threats from the coronavirus and the lockdowns has been very difficult for many families. Some have had to struggle in limited accommodation and are unable to go out feel an intensity of stress on being cooped up together. Family members in care homes are deprived of family visits to sustain their contact, relationships and emotional and mental wellbeing. Others families who live in areas of war and conflict, oppression and discrimination move out to join the world's vast procession of refugees and asylum seekers and leave everything perhaps even to lose their life.

Looking at the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph, we see people in our time can identify with them. Mary and Joseph did not have a privileged existence but had to struggle with poverty and escape as refugees to Egypt in order to protect the life of their child, Jesus, who was in danger of being killed by king Herod. However, at the beginning of their child's life they bring him up to the temple in Jerusalem to present and dedicate him to the Lord and for the service of God. At a Baptism I think the journey parents make in bringing their child to church for Baptism is a parallel spiritual journey to what Mary and Joseph made as they brought their child to the Temple and presented him to God for dedication.

We see too the goodness of human nature in adverse circumstances as many take risks in difficult situations to care for and help others, especially the vulnerable. The holy man, Simeon, desired to see God come to people at a sad time. As he interceded and prayed for people, we need to follow his example and intercede for those in pain or who suffer in some way. We first belong to our own family, but we also belong to God's family in the church and to the wider human family. As we receive much from each one of these, we also have the responsibility to contribute to and strengthen each of them with our acts of service and our prayer.

As we come to the end of this year, I wish to thank you for your prayerful support, active help and care during the year. I wish you and your families a very safe, healthy and happy New Year. May God especially bless & protect you. Fr John

BOOKING TO ATTEND SUNDAY MASS AT EPPING CATHOLIC CHURCH IT IS MOST IMPORTANT THAT YOU BOOK TO ATTEND A WEEKEND MASS

Due to the restrictions imposed by the Coronavirus pandemic regulations the capacity of our church for people attending Mass is limited to 55, where people are from the same household, or 23 individuals. To avoid the possibility of people being told on coming to church that it is full and one cannot go in, it is most important to book a place at a particular Mass.

- 1. It is important to book a place(s) to attend Mass on a Saturday evening or Sunday. If you will attend that Mass every weekend, your name will be put on the list permanently for that Mass. If you cannot come to that Mass on a weekend(s) it is important that you notify us so that places that are free can be allocated to others.
- 2. Please notify Deacon Duncan by 5pm on the previous Friday for attendance at a weekend Mass on Saturday at 6pm or on Sunday at 9am or 11am. Bookings for multiple weekends can be made at the same time. If you are changing or cancelling a booking you have made for a particular Mass, please do so by Friday at 5pm.

If we are over-subscribed for a particular Mass, he will contact you. The 5pm deadline for bookings on Fridays allows time for you to make other arrangements and free up a place for others.
