STAY SAFE IN CHURCH: We have heard churches are being checked to ensure correct procedures are followed to prevent the spread of Covid19. Cleaning and ventilation are essential. Three times in two weeks our Diocese has sent us instructions to protect people and limit the spread of this dangerous virus. In Epping Forest, we are in one of the most infected area of England. Everyone must wear a mask or a face covering in church, except when reading. We must sanitise our hands on entering and leaving church and keep social distance of 2 meters (6 feet), not interact with people inside or outside church who are not in our group - scan the QR code or register on attending church for track and trace as we enter or leave the church. If you display Covid like symptoms, have tested positive for Covid19, or been instructed to quarantine, you must not come to church but follow the directions given by the National Health Service and the Government.

SECOND (PEACE) SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME B 17 January 2021

Dear Friends,

"Speak, Lord, your servant is listening", Eli, the priest, told the boy Samuel to say to the Lord, when he heard him call (1Sam.3:3-19). In Baptism our ears and mouth are blessed by the priest, so that we may listen to God's word with our ears, and offer prayer to him with our lips. It is easier for us to talk than to listen; but we need to listen to God's word and hear him speak in our heart and through people, so that we may know his way and plan for us.

Eli, the priest was not a holy man, but he was chosen by God to lead a young boy on the way to holiness and to become God's prophet for the people. The hymn "I the Lord of sea and sky" reflects the obedient words of this young boy who said; "Here I am Lord. Is it I Lord? I have heard you calling in the night. I will go, Lord, if you lead me. I will hold your people in my heart".

John the Baptist points out Jesus as the "Lamb of God" who is to lead people to God. Some of John's disciples left him immediately to follow Jesus. They recognized him as the Messiah and tell others they have found the Christ. Do I choose to follow Christ as his first disciples did? Do I desire to spend time with him in quiet and in prayer? Do I listen to his Word and accept the teaching and guidance he gives to me through the Church? Does his word and what he says inform my way of thinking and acting, or am I led by what everyone says and does or what I think myself? Do I cut out the busyness and noise of the world, even for a short time, to listen to the Lord in silence and prayer? Am I present to him in prayer during the day or at night?

If our being present to Christ has been limited to Sunday Mass, we are so to speak, running on the minimum. We need to let God communicate daily with us in private and public prayer, so that we grow in relationship with him. In our busy life, we need some quiet and silence, so that God's "still small voice of calm", may be heard in our heart, when speaking. We can pray and turn to him at home on our own or with family, at work, in the car or walking. Our prayer should be formed by the principles Jesus gave us in Lord's Prayer: to praise God, ask him for our needs and pray that his will be done. *May God bless you with a listening ear and heart. Fr John*

IT IS MOST IMPORTANT THAT YOU BOOK TO ATTEND A WEEKEND MASS IN EPPING CATHOLIC CHURCH

Due to the restrictions imposed by the Coronavirus pandemic regulations the capacity of our church for people attending Mass is limited to 55, where people are from the same household, or 23 individuals. To avoid the possibility of people being told on coming to church that it is full and one cannot go in, it is most important to book a place at a particular Mass.

- 1. It is important to book a place(s) to attend Mass on a Saturday evening or Sunday. If you will attend that Mass every weekend, your name will be put on the list permanently for that Mass. If you cannot come to that Mass on a weekend(s) it is important that you notify us so that places that are free can be allocated to others.
- 2. Please notify Deacon Duncan by 5pm on the previous Friday for attendance at a weekend Mass on Saturday at 6pm or on Sunday at 9am or 11am. Bookings for multiple weekends can be made at the same time. If you are changing or cancelling a booking you have made for a particular Mass, please do so by Friday at 5pm.
- 3. To make bookings for weekend Masses, change or cancel a booking email **Deacon Duncan at** duncanjcjwhitehouse@gmail.com or phone 01992 577173. If we are over-subscribed for a particular Mass, he will contact you. The 5pm deadline for bookings on Fridays allows time for you to make other arrangements and free up a place for others.
