STAY SAFE IN CHURCH: We have heard churches are being checked to ensure correct procedures are followed to prevent the spread of Covid19. Cleaning and ventilation are essential. Three times in two weeks our Diocese has sent us instructions to protect people and limit the spread of this dangerous virus. In Epping Forest, we are in one of the most infected area of England. Everyone must wear a mask or a face covering in church, except when reading. We must sanitise our hands on entering and leaving church and keep social distance of 2 meters (6 feet), not interact with people inside or outside church who are not in our group - scan the QR code or register on attending church for track and trace as we enter or leave the church. If you display Covid like symptoms, have tested positive for Covid19, or been instructed to quarantine, you must not come to church but follow the directions given by the National Health Service and the Government.

FIFTH SUNDAY in ORDINARY TIME (B) 7th February 2021

Dear Friends,

"In the morning, long before dawn, Jesus got up, left the house, and went off to a lonely place and prayed there" (Mark 1:29-39). St Mark shows Jesus busy with the mission he had to complete in a short time. In the midst of activity he went off to spend time in prayer, alone with God. Through communioninf prayer with his Father, the Spirit empowered Jesus "to go about doing good",. During his mission of preaching and healing, working miracles or casting out of devils, Jesus prayed and told his disciples to pray for the strength to resist weakness. He prayed on the night before he chose his apostles and prayed for them and or us in his Priestly Prayer at the Last Supper (John Ch.17). He prayed in agony in the garden to do his Father's will and his last prayer on the Cross was to forgive his enemies.

Life can be busy as we can preoccupy ourselves with little things. We can find it difficult to tear ourselves away from what we are doing to spend time alone with God in prayer. We may feel like not praying and find it holds no reward for us – that was the experience of St Teresa of Calcutta for many years.. During or after prayer we may feel no closer to God and wonder what is the point. In praying at such times we offer our best prayer to God, for we go against our own instincts and sacrifice our time to him. We also know that God blesses all who pray and Jesus prays for us and with us to the Father (Jn.17). St Paul tells us the Holy Spirit living in us offers to the Father the prayer that we are incapable of making ourselves, and that his prayer is in keeping with the mind of God (Rom.8:26).

We need to pray alone in private and in public with and for people in church. We should pray thanking God in the morning in for bringing us to a new day and ask him to protect and bless our families and ourselves during the day. We could pray the Rosary, even one decade in the car with children on a school run, or going to work. We pray at night thanking God for the good things of the day, begging his forgiveness for our sins and asking him to protect our family and us during the night. We can pray using our phone, Tablet or the Psalms in the Bible. We pray to God as we make important decisions, face difficulties or in support those who are vulnerable or ill, especially those who are struggling in this time of pandemic.

In turning to God in prayer, it shows that we depend him and not ourselves alone, for we are asking him to come to our aid and to be our protector and Saviour.

May God bless and protect you and your families. Fr John
