FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT (B)

21st February 2021

Dear Friends.

"The Spirit drove Jesus out into the wilderness and he remained there for forty days, and was tempted by Satan. He was with the wild beasts and the angels looked after him" (Mark 1:12-15). Mark's gives this forceful account of Jesus going out into the desert, being alone and confronted and tempted by Satan. Many people today naïvely deny the existence of Satan, saying that he belongs to the time of Jesus and the past, and has no relevance for us today.

When Cardinal Estavez presented the new Rite of Exorcism in 1999, he said "the existence of the devil is not an opinion; it belongs to Catholic faith and doctrine; the strategy of the devil is to convince people he does not exist. The devil manages to trap people and fool them by leading them to believe happiness can be found in money, power and sexual lust. He deceives men and women by persuading them that they do not need God and that they are self-sufficient".

When Jesus was at his weakest, the devil tempted him in three powerful ways. To work a miracle for his own benefit by turning stones into bread when he was hungry. To engage in a foolish act and presume God would save him. To imagine he could control peoples and nations by worshipping the devil. Jesus rejected the temptations, with the power of the Spirit, and ordered the devil to depart - "but he was to return again to at the appointed time". The devil tempts us in various ways, especially when we are weak or vulnerable. He wants us to be discontent, and with false promises increases our expectations and then leaves us disappointed. He draws people into sinful ways, even into the occult, and when trapped in his power he then seeks to run and ruin good lives and relationships.

While Jesus was tempted when vulnerable and weak it strengthened and prepared him for mission by resisting temptations. He proclaimed the Good News of the kingdom of God soon after his temptations and called people to repent of their sins (Matt.12). Lent can be a time of training for us, when we can be tested and faced with our weaknesses. Like Christ, it is the power of God that protects and delivers us from the temptations of the devil. God's power, the power of love to save, is utterly certain, and always triumphs over evil. And so we pray daily in the Lord's Prayer, "Lord, lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil".

May God bless and send his holy angel to guard and protect you. Fr John
