Dear Friends and Parishioners.

Jesus said, "I am the true vine, you are the branches. Whoever remains in me, with me in him, bears fruit in plenty; but cut off from me you can do nothing" (John 15:1-8). With the coming of spring, new life is blooming all around us in nature. Beautiful flowers, the blossoms and green on the trees, show God's creativeness and loveliness. Jesus uses the image of the Vine, that gives life to its branches to show that he gives life to each person who is a member of his body, the Church. Last Sunday Jesus gave us the image of himself as the Good Shepherd (John 10:11) who looks after his flock and lays down his life for them. Today we have Jesus as the vine, who gives new life and joy to people. Just as we have the new life in spring following death in nature in winter; so too we have the new life of grace at Easter through Christ's resurrection, following his death on Good Friday.

If we are to share in the new life of grace we must live according to God's law, for Christ tells us, "Anyone loves me, will keep my commandments". Some claim to be Christian, but advocate beliefs and live in ways that are opposed to Christ and his law. As we recognise God's call to be holy, we struggle with our human weakness and our conscience tells us that we fail. In these situations we confess our sins, and seek Christ's forgiveness so as to be reconciled to God and one another. It is illogical to say that one is a committed Christian (meaning: in a communion of mind and heart with Christ), but oppose by word or way of life his teachings. We live in God and he lives in us by keeping his commandments that (1Jn.3:24).

By our Baptism we are joined to Christ, the true vine and in receiving him in Holy Communion we enter into an intimacy and communion with him, that surpasses the intimacy between husband and wife in marriage. We need, therefore, to receive Christ with a view to living in a relationship of love with him, continuously. In Holy Communion, he comes into our life with love, and makes his home in us. To complete the circle of love in our relationship with Christ and others, we must make our spiritual home and way of life in him.

May Christ, the true Vine, bless you with his life-giving love. Fr John

THE YEAR OF ST JOSEPH: Pope Francis has declared a year of St Joseph, Patron of the Universal Church, from the 8 December 2020, the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, to same Feast this year. This **Saturday** 1st **May**, is the Feast of St Joseph the Worker, He was a father who teaches the value, dignity and joy of work. A carpenter who earned an honest living to provide for his family, "St Joseph teaches us "the value, the dignity and joy of what it means to eat bread that is the fruit of one's own labour." This aspect of Joseph's character provides Pope Francis the opportunity to launch an appeal in favour of work, which has become a "burning social issue" even in countries with a certain level of well-being. "There is a renewed need to appreciate the importance of dignified work, of which Saint Joseph is an exemplary patron," the Pope writes. Work, he says, "is a means of participating in the work of salvation, an opportunity to hasten the coming of the Kingdom, to develop our talents and abilities, and to put them at the service of society and fraternal communion." Those who work, he explains, "are cooperating with God himself, and in some way become creators of the world around us." Pope Francis encourages everyone "to rediscover the value, the importance and the necessity of work for bringing about a new "normal" from which no one is excluded, "Especially in light of rising unemployment due to the Covid-19 pandemic, the Pope calls everyone to "review our priorities" and to express our firm conviction that no young person, no person at all, no family should be without work!"

IT IS MOST IMPORTANT THAT YOU BOOK TO ATTEND WEEKEND MASSES IN EPPING CATHOLIC CHURCH

Most people will know of the intervention by police, at a Catholic Church in London, that brought the Good Friday afternoon service to an abrupt end and people were ordered to leave the church and go home. This leads us to look at our procedures and the necessity of booking places in our church for weekend and Feast day Masses to ensure we comply with Covid regulations.

Churches were permitted to reopen for people at services last July on completing a risk assessment and compliance with Covid19 regulations. **In our church we are allowed only 23 single individuals, or 55 people** of family groups from the same bubble or house. The gallery in our church is not available for general use due to the lack of screens, social distancing problems and the danger of spreading the virus over the balcony by aerosols.

- You need to book a place in church for a particular weekend Mass. In the plan of our church, seats will be filled as bookings are made to Deacon Duncan by email at: duncanjcjwhitehouse@gmail.com or phone on 01992 577173 by 5pm on Friday evenings. Bookings sent to our Parish Office are forwarded to Deacon Duncan for completing.
- If you book places at a weekend Mass, have to change time or cannot attend, please notify Deacon Duncan as soon as possible so that places can then be allocated to other parishioners.
- If people have not booked in good time for a particular weekend Mass, it may not be possible for them to enter the church, if places are already taken or it is full. Those who book will be allowed to take their places first.
- You must not come to church if you are vulnerable or have Covid symptoms.

These procedures may cause problems for all of us and we regret having to go down this route for safety. However, we must not take the risk of spreading the virus by breaking regulations, having our services halted, people being sent home or our church being closed as has happened in other places. Fr John

STAY SAFE IN CHURCH: We must all wear masks or face coverings in church, except when reading. We must sanitise our hands as we enter and leave church and keep a social distance of 2 meters (6 feet), not interact with people inside or outside church who are not in our group and scan the QR code or register on attending church for track & trace as we enter or leave. If you show Covid symptoms, been tested positive for Covid19, or told to stay at home/quarantine, you must follow NHS directions and not come to church.
