SEVENTH SUNDAY OF EASTER B World Communications Day 16.5.2021

Dear Friends and Parishioners,

Jesus prayed, in his Priestly Prayer, "Holy Father, keep those you have given me true to your name, so that they may be one like us" (Jn.17:11-19). At the Last Supper, Jesus offered up this great prayer for his disciples and for all, including ourselves, who would come to believe in him through the ages. His prayer in a time of danger was not focused on himself or his own deliverance from evil, but for others and fulfilling God's will. He prayed that God's plan to save people from evil, sin and death would be fulfilled through his sufferings and death.

Jesus prayed that no one be lost and that all be saved. Sometimes people think and speak as if an individual is not very important. Our faith tells us that every person is important, for God has created each one in love and has destined them to "know, love and serve him on earth and to share in his glory in heaven". Jesus shows how precious each person is in the eyes of God as he prays that all will be saved from sin, death and condemnations. He also prays that God, his and our Father, will protect people from the evil one, the Devil, who destroys lives by leading people into falsehood and sin. We need to join in Jesus' prayer, so that God may protect his people and that they may live in the way of truth.

"I am the Way, the Truth and the Life, no one can come to the Father, except through me", Jesus said. He prayed in his Priestly Prayer: "Father, consecrate them in the truth, your word is truth". Today, some people are more ready and willing to believe what is not true than they are to believe the truth, which is in Sacred Scripture. That truth contained in the Bible is the Word of God for us and is articulated and amplified in the Church's teaching tradition. We need to consecrate ourselves in the truth and not treat it as something optional or no longer relevant. By living in the truth, we protect ourselves from falsehood and the deceits of the Devil and others, and we sustain right relationships with God and people. The truth sets us free and unites people to Christ and one another.

We are now in the novena or nine days of prayer leading up to Pentecost. If you have not yet started to pray for a new outpouring of the Holy Spirit in your own life and the lives of others, especially in family, please start that prayer today. All of us want the Spirit of Wisdom, Truth and Love in our life and the lives of others, and that is what the Holy Spirit offers to us at Pentecost.

May the Lord send his Holy Spirit into our lives in new ways. Fr John

IT IS MOST IMPORTANT THAT YOU BOOK TO ATTEND WEEKEND MASSES IN EPPING CATHOLIC CHURCH

Churches were permitted to reopen for people to attend services last July on completing risk assessments and compliance with Covid regulations. In our church we are allowed only 23 single individuals, or 55 people of family groups from the same bubble or house, at any one time. The gallery in our church is not for general use due to the lack of screens, social distancing problems and the danger of spreading the virus over the balcony by aerosols.

- You need to book a place in church for a particular weekend Mass. In the plan of our church, seats will be filled as bookings are made to Deacon Duncan by email at: duncanjcjwhitehouse@gmail.com or phone on 01992 577173 by 5pm on Friday evenings. Bookings sent to our Parish Office are forwarded to Deacon Duncan for completing.
- After booking for a Mass, if you cannot attend or must change time, please notify Deacon Duncan immediately so that others can have those places.
- If people have not booked in good time for a particular weekend Mass, it may not be possible for them to enter for Mass, if places are already taken or the church is full. Those who book will be allowed to take their places first.
- You must not come to church if you are vulnerable or have Covid symptoms.

These procedures cause problems for all of us and we regret having to go down this route for safety. However, we must not take the risk of spreading the virus by breaking regulations, having our services halted, people being sent home or our church being closed as has happened in other places. Fr John

STAY SAFE IN CHURCH: We must all wear masks or face coverings in church, except when reading. We must sanitise our hands as we enter and leave church and keep a social distance of 2 meters (6 feet), not interact with people inside or outside church who are not in our group and scan the QR code or register on attending church for track & trace as we enter or leave. If you show Covid symptoms, been tested positive for Covid19, or told to stay at home/quarantine, you must follow NHS directions and not come to church.
