SOLEMNITY OF CORPUS CHRISTI

## 6<sup>th</sup> June 2021

#### Dear Friends and Parishioners,

Jesus said, "I am the living bread which has come down from heaven, anyone who eats this bread will live forever" (John Ch.6). On this feast of Corpus Christi we celebrate the immense gift Jesus gave us at his Last Supper – His Body and Blood, His whole life and his Real Presence. In Holy Communion Jesus gives us the privilege of entering into Holy Communion with himself and shares his life and love with us at the deepest level. In receiving Holy Communion we share in his sacrifice when he laid down his life not just for his friends, but for us, while we were still his enemies, in a self-centred and hostile relationship with God. He says "This is my Body which is broken for you .. this is my Blood which is poured out for you for the forgiveness of sins".

Most moving descriptions of Christ's presence in Holy Communion are given in the reflections of the French Jesuit priest, Fr Pierre Teilhard de Chardin in his book, Le Milieu Divin. As a chaplain to French troops in the trenches in the First World war he reflected that he was carrying the Host, Holy Communion, in a pyx next to his heart. There he and the soldiers, were blessed to have the God of love in the person of Jesus, sharing his life and love with them in midst of terrible sufferings and the evils of war. He also reflected on the Host in the Monstance radiating out God's love for people and the world. For us too, it is our privilege and blessing to receive Christ in Holy Communion, to share in his life and love and to be brought into a holy communion with him and one another, in the Christian community, the Body of Christ, the Church.

Next Saturday, the 12<sup>th</sup> June, will be the fiftieth anniversary of my ordination to the priesthood, with twenty-three other young men, at the Cathedral of the Assumption in Thurles, Co Tipperary. I consider this an occasion of "humble thanksgiving to our Lord Jesus Christ, our Great High Priest", for having called me to share in his life and ministry and the privilege of being able to minister his grace to his people in different places and circumstances. I am most grateful to Bishop Alan for his kindness in coming to our Mass next Saturday evening to join in the thanksgiving. It has been a privilege for me to serve God and his people in this Diocese of Brentwood, which I consider to be my spiritual home. *May God bless you and keep you in a holy communion of love. Fr John*

## IT IS MOST IMPORTANT THAT YOU BOOK TO ATTEND WEEKEND MASSES IN EPPING CATHOLIC CHURCH

Churches were permitted to reopen for people to attend services last July on completing risk assessments and compliance with Covid regulations. In our church we are now allowed 75 people. The gallery in our church is not for general use due to the lack of screens, social distancing problems and the danger of spreading the virus over the balcony by aerosols. Changes are coming in church regarding some Covid regulations. Most are minor at this time, but we still need to be careful, not only for our-self but for the sake of others. When we think of others rather than our-self, we have compelling reasons to act with charity and social responsibility for the good of all. In that way, we are witnesses to our faith and show Christ active in our life.

- You STILL need to book a place in church for a particular weekend Mass. In the plan of our church, seats will be filled as bookings are made to Deacon Duncan by email at: <u>duncanjcjwhitehouse@gmail.com</u> or phone on 01992 577173 by 5pm on Friday evenings. Bookings sent to our Parish Office are forwarded to Deacon Duncan for completing.
- After booking for a Mass, if you cannot attend or must change time, please notify Deacon Duncan immediately so that others can have those places.
- If people have not booked in good time for a particular weekend Mass, it may not be possible for them to enter for Mass, if places are already taken or the church is full. Those who book will be allowed to take their places first.
- You must not come to church if you are vulnerable or have Covid symptoms.

These procedures cause problems for all of us and we regret having to go down this route for safety. However, we must not take the risk of spreading the virus by breaking regulations, having our services halted, people being sent home or our church being closed as has happened in other places. **STAY SAFE IN CHURCH:** We must all wear masks or face coverings in church, except when reading. We must sanitise our hands as we enter and leave church and keep a social distance of 1 meter, not interact with people inside or outside church who are not in our group and scan the QR code or register on attending church for track & trace as we enter or leave. If you show Covid symptoms, been tested positive for Covid19, or told to stay at home/quarantine, you must follow NHS directions and not come to church.
