THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK

Most of us recognise the importance of listening to the Readings at Mass and are aware that when we listen to these Readings, each of us is hearing God's message to us personally, in our own particular circumstances. Many of us will have our 'usual way' of receiving what will be arguably the most important guidance we will receive until we come to Mass again, guidance which will enable us to follow God faithfully as we live our normal life. But how many of us could recall the gist of each Reading we hear? How well do we listen to what is being read? Is there a way in which we might remember more about the guidance God is giving us?

One way in which we might better hear and understand the Readings at Mass is to imagine that we are actually present at the time at which the Reading is being acted-out. We can experience the joy and the pain, the power and the weakness, the certainty and the doubt, as though we are intimately involved in all that is happening. We can relate to each person in a Reading whose situation is being related to us, and be able to understand as though we were present at the time of the situation – and we shall find it easier to remember what God is saying to us when we reflect upon the Readings later in the day.

God bless you, particularly as we continue to struggle with COVID.

IT IS MOST IMPORTANT THAT YOU BOOK TO ATTEND WEEKEND MASSES IN EPPING CATHOLIC CHURCH

Churches were permitted to reopen for people to attend services last July on completing risk assessments and compliance with Covid regulations. In our church we are now allowed 75 people. The gallery in our church is not for general use due to the lack of screens, social distancing problems and the danger of spreading the virus over the balcony by aerosols. Changes are coming in church regarding some Covid regulations. Most are minor at this time, but we still need to be careful, not only for our-self but for the sake of others. When we think of others rather than our-self, we have compelling reasons to act with charity and social responsibility for the good of all. In that way, we are witnesses to our faith and show Christ active in our life.

- You STILL need to book a place in church for a particular weekend Mass. In the plan of our church, seats will be filled as bookings are made to Deacon Duncan by email at: <u>duncanjcjwhitehouse@gmail.com</u> or phone on 01992 577173 by 5pm on Friday evenings. Bookings sent to our Parish Office are forwarded to Deacon Duncan for completing.
- After booking for a Mass, if you cannot attend or must change time, please notify Deacon Duncan immediately so that others can have those places.
- If people have not booked in good time for a particular weekend Mass, it may not be possible for them to enter for Mass, if places are already taken or the church is full. Those who book will be allowed to take their places first.
- You must not come to church if you are vulnerable or have Covid symptoms.

These procedures cause problems for all of us and we regret having to go down this route for safety. However, we must not take the risk of spreading the virus by breaking regulations, having our services halted, people being sent home or our church being closed as has happened in other places.
