THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK

The history of divine law, which we follow as Christians, begins in the love of God and his divine creation. It is very tempting to confuse our written laws with divine law. The Word of the Lord is the divine law, and that law is wider, deeper longer and higher than any written laws which are composed by humans for human guidance. No written law can adequately express God's love for his people. The written law, which the whole population is required to follow, is only a pale reflection of a part of divine law – divine law which is based upon God's love and grace.

This weekend's Gospel is an interesting example of the difference between human regulations and the commandments of God, and shows Jesus trying to reshape the attitude of the Jewish authorities with regard to their traditions. It is important for us to remember that clinging to human regulations cannot be claimed to be on a par with observing God's commandments. It is what comes from the mind and heart that makes a person either a disciple or an advocate of unworthiness.

The greatness of God's law cannot be contained in any law contrived by human authority, because God's law is simply written on the hearts of believers. Once it is written on our hearts, then God's Word, God's wisdom and God's law will guide us towards everything that is perfect in God's eyes, provided that we listen to him..
