THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK

This weekend's Gospel reading discloses something of Jesus' forthright thoughts about generosity and invites us to focus on our support for those in need.

So many projects and causes in the Catholic Church depend upon relatively small gifts from the large number of poorer people in our society. This illustrates the common truth that generosity is more widespread amongst those who have little to spare compared with the generosity shown by those with ample means. It is good to remember that even small donations made for the glory of God are worthy of praise such as that given to the poor widow in this weekend's Gospel reading, 'She gave everything she possessed; all that she had to live on'.

In our technological age, we are more aware than any previous generations about the hunger and deprivation of people in undeveloped countries and in inner cities. Vast numbers experience high unemployment, homelessness and starvation. Does this inspire us to be more generous with our giving? Do we feel moved to help those in need, particularly in the light of the devastation brought about by the farreaching effects of worldwide Climate Change?

Awareness of our Christian responsibilities, should prompt us to be outspoken in our call for justice and for international co-operation in addressing the urgent needs of the poor and at the same time making our personal contribution to alleviate hardship wherever we can, remembering the response of Jesus to the generosity of the poor widow in this weekend's Gospel reading.
