OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST THE KING B Youth Day 21 November 2021

Dear friends and Parishioners,

Jesus said, "Yes, I am a King. For this I was born. For this I came into the world, to bear witness to the truth, and all who are in the side of truth listen to my voice" (John 18:33-37). As we come to the end of the liturgical year, the Church turns our thoughts to Christ as the King who will come again to judge the living and the dead, and present a redeemed creation as an acceptable gift to God, his Father. His judgement will be true, since he is Truth, the Way that leads to the Father and the Life of the world. No one will be able to manipulate or cover up the truth in his presence. The truth about our words and actions. our thoughts and motives will be revealed in the presence of Christ. It will be the moment of truth, when we will fully understand the reality of our life and the need to be saved by his mercy.

When Christ judges he will focus on how we express our love of God in love of neighbour. Those who are the weakest and in the most vulnerable situations are the people who have the first and greatest claim on our love. The way we treat them is the way we treat Christ himself. Do we love the impoverished, the hungry, and the homeless, do we welcome strangers into our society, do we care for the sick and look-after those in prison? Jesus will judge kindly and welcome those who show compassion and love to others, and he will say, "as long as you did it to one of the least of these my brothers or sisters, you did it to me".

Today is World Youth Sunday. It is necessary for young people to see Christ as having an essential place in their life. We have images of Christ to help us appreciate his relationship with us, especially in the hymn, "Hail, Redeemer, King divine", saying "King most holy, King of truth, guide the lowly, guide the youth; Christ thou King of glory bright, be to us eternal light". We may think we can manage or cope on our own, but we know that we need help from others and from our Christ, our Saviour, which is why many prayers being with, "O God, come to our aid. O Lord make haste to help us". Pope Benedict said, "If we let Christ into our lives, we lose nothing, absolutely nothing of what makes life free, beautiful and great. Only in his friendship are the doors of life opened wide. I say to you, dear young people, Do not be afraid of Christ! He takes nothing away from you and gives you everything".

May Christ, the King of Glory rule our minds, hearts and wills. Fr John
