THE NATIVITY OF THE LORD, JESUS CHRIST C 25th December 2021

Dear Friends and Parishioners,

"Mary gave birth to a son, here first born. She wrapped him in swaddling clothes, and laid him in a manger because there was no room for them at the inn" (Lk.2:1-14). Jesus' birth, which we celebrate at Christmas, is Emmanuel, "God with us". God became man in Jesus to bring God to us, and bring us to God. Mary his mother was the first person to welcome Jesus into the world, in obedience to God's will, as she said, "I am the servant of the Lord, let it be done to me according to your word" (Luke 1:38). Joseph her husband, received the Word of God, and made a decision to obey it in relationship with Mary. The challenge for us, as for Joseph and Mary, is to live our relationships and life according to God's plan and to put his will before our own. When we live according to God's will, great things can be achieved through us, as they were through Mary and Joseph.

Many families in our parish are blessed with children and new life. When we look into the face of the infant, we ought tell ourselves that it is like we are looking into the face of Christ. The new-born child in the manger was like us or any child in every way. The glory of God is made visible to us in the face and life of a child, and our own face,, but it is seen most perfectly in the face of Jesus. He became man like us in all things, except sin, and took our human nature in order to share with us the divine nature of God, and so enable us to be a holy and saved people.

In celebrating the birth of Jesus we hear a message of peace to people of goodwill from God. God places in the human hearts an expectancy and desire for peace and reconciliation at Christmas. In this holy season, he calls for divisions to be healed, and hatreds abandoned and converted into love. Christmas can be difficult for people affected by divisions, rancour or hostilities. At Christmas people have a sense that they are intended, by God, to be united in love and go forward in peace. Whilst the message of peace to people of good will was given at Christmas, over two thousand years ago, it is a message that is addressed anew to everyone today.

God wants us to pray and work for peace and to be peace-makers. Some people falsely think that their conflict, violence or terrorism that cause suffering or death, are all right, but those of others are wrong. At Christmas, Christ the Prince of Peace, offers the gift of peace to men and women of good will, and through him God tells us that he wants peace in every heart and home, every nation and place. *May Christ, the Prince of Peace bless and protect you this Christmas.
