SIXTH SUNDAY Year C RACIAL JUSTICE DAY 13th February.2022

Dear Friends and Parishioners,

"A blessing on the man who puts his trust in the Lord; with the Lord for his hope" (Jeremiah 17:5-8). In the Beatitudes (Luke 6:17-26). Jesus speaks of the blessings God gives to people who place their trust in him in various situations. He teaches that God does not abandon people in their sufferings or difficulties, but that he is with them and blesses them. To understand this, we look to Jesus himself who was born in poverty and homelessness, whose life as an infant was threatened and became a refugee, who experienced rejection, condemnation and shared the suffering and death of the innocent by dying on a cross. Yet, in all his trials and difficulties he turned to God his Father in prayer and submitted humbly to him who saves people from condemnation, sin and death, through his resurrection..

Moses told the people, when God was making a Covenant with them; "See, I set before you today a blessing and a curse" (Deut. 11:26). In The Beatitudes, Jesus teaches that relationships with God and people are linked. God blesses people in different and testing situations and shows compassion and love, often in unrecognisable ways, to those going through difficult times. God blesses people in their trials and sufferings and sees them as brothers and sisters with Christ, who suffered to save people. Christ was dedicated to the will of his Father and to love for people and he calls us to have a commitment to love God and neighbour. Commitment is a grace that helps sustain relationships and should lead us live in hope and trust with God and people. Commitment helps bring the blessings of the Beatitudes on others as well as ourselves; by sustaining our relationships we grow in a love, which is greatly blessed, and is holy and human.

The lockdown restrictions to protect people from the Coronavirus have had a serious effect on all of us and on community life. Ways of thinking, visiting, relating and working together were affected and we need to think on how we rebuild and reintegrate again in a new normal. We need people to help rediscover and take forward aspects of our parish and community life that served the wider community and ourselves well in the past and may do so again. For families, and personally, one of the great losses was not having the freedom to visit people at home, in hospitals or care homes. We pray that the sense of hurt and loss people suffered with that in the past will be healed. With wisdom and caution, may we be able to go forward with faith and hope, guided by the Holy Spirit.

May Lord bless and protect you in difficult times and situations. Fr John
