THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT YEAR C

20th March 2022

Dear friends and Parishioners,

God called from the middle of the burning bush and said, "Moses, Moses, come no nearer. Take your shoes off for the place on which you stand is holy ground" (Exodus 3:1-15). There is an increasing sense of the need to protect the environment but a diminishing sense of the sacred in our world. People can be blinded by the material so that they do not see God's presence in a person, a bush or creation. The sacred and spiritual are central to sustain life and nature but are often not recognised. Like Moses, we could be walking on holy ground or sacred space, but not recognise the presence and holiness of God.

We go into a Church and genuflect with our right knee touching our left heel on the floor, to show we honour God who is in a sacred place. On entering a Mosque, people take off their shoes, as Moses did, to show that they walk on holy ground in the presence of God and must honour him. Whilst God is present everywhere, we must always honour him in people and holy places. We need to be aware that his presence is real to us in the Church - a building consecrated to God where his people gather for worship and prayer. That is why we bow or genuflect and are silent before him. God who is present as his Word, the Sacred Scriptures, are read aloud to people, and is truly present in Holy Communion. He is present "where two or three are gathered in his name".

The many and varied presences of God are a comfort and strength to us in the various situations we go through, for the Lord does not leave us to journey or cope alone in life but is with us at all times and places. St Patrick, whose feast we celebrated on Thursday, expressed that beautifully in his prayer: "Christ, be beside me, Christ be before me, Christ be behind me, King of my heart ...". We should use his prayer or hymn as a consistent part of our own prayer, as it reflects to us God's ongoing presence, support and constant love for us.

We will welcome Bishop Alan, our Bishop on a Pastoral Visit to our parish on Wednesday, 23rd March, when he will celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation for thirteen young parishioners at evening Mass. We pray for all who have been preparing for Confirmation and the Sacraments in our Parish. *May the Lord strengthen them, and all of us, with his Spirit and lead us forward in our faith journey with a greater reverence, a stronger faith and deeper love. Fr John.*
