FIFTH SUNDAY IN LENT YEAR C

**Dear Friends and Parishioners.** 

3rd APRIL 2022

Jesus said, "Has no one condemned you?" She said, "No one". Jesus said, "Neither do I condemn you. Go away and don't sin anymore" (John 8:1-11). In this Gospel, religious men brought a woman caught committing adultery to Jesus and asked him to condemn her to death. Full of self-righteousness, they show no mercy or compassion to the woman. People have changed little, for right down through the ages there are some who are always ready to condemn others for their human weakness and sins, but blind to their own sins. An old proverb says: "There is so much good in the worst of us, and so much bad in the best of us, that it ill behoves any of us to find fault with the rest of us". Jesus only condemned those wilfully blind to their own faults who went around condemning others and he told us, "Do not judge and you will not be judged".

Lent is a time when Christ calls us to look into ourselves to see the faults and sins in our own life. It is easy and tempting to look at other people's sins and faults but be blind to our own sins and failings. Christ calls us in Lent to look into our minds and hearts and recognise our own personal sins, and then to turn to him with humble and contrite hearts and seek his forgiveness and love.

Today, many of us do not see a need to identify our sins or failings and so do not see the need to come to Christ for the forgiveness of sins and the grace and be renewed by God's forgiving love. At the beginning of Mass we call to mind our sins, and say to God and to each other, "I confess that I have sinned, in my thoughts and in my words, in what I have done and in what I have failed to do…" and ask God to forgive us as we petition saying: "Lord, have mercy".

On Thursday we celebrate the Sacrament of Penance at the Lent Penance Service in our church. We will have a visiting priest to hear Confessions, and have the usual times of celebrating the Sacrament on Saturdays from 11.30am to 12 noon. Anyone wishing to receive the grace of this Sacrament but unable to get to Church, or does not find these times suitable, can always ask me and I will oblige on this as a priority, and if necessary visit people at home. To grow in love for God and people we need to come to the Lord for the forgiveness of our sins, being freed from guilt and healed from our hurts. *May the Lord bless us with forgiveness & peace. Fr John*
