PALM SUNDAY OF THE PASSION OF THE LORD C 10 APRIL 2022

Dear Friends and Parishioners.

"His state was divine, yet Christ Jesus did not cling to his equality with God but emptied himself to assume the condition of a slave and became as all men are" (Philippians 2:6-11). St Paul tells us of the divine and human nature of Jesus who gave up his glory and was humbler by going through suffering and death on the Cross. On Palm Sunday the Church takes us into Jesus' passing glory. In Holy Week, we enter his sufferings and being glorified through death on the Cross. He, the innocent Lamb of God, was put to death, and through his sufferings, death and resurrection God gives us hope and the promise of eternal life

On Wednesday at 11am in Brentwood Cathedral on Bishop Alan will celebrate the Chrism Mass with the priests and people of our Diocese. At that Mass priests will renew their commitment of ordination and Holy Oils will be blessed. The Oil of Baptism to prepare people for Baptism. The Oil of Chrism to anoint people at Baptism and seal them with the gift of the Holy Spirit in Confirmation. It is used at the ordination of men as priests in Holy Orders, for the service of God and people, and also used to consecrate Churches and Altars for the service of God.

On Maundy Thursday evening we celebrate the Mass of The Lord's Supper, remembering Jesus instituting the Holy Eucharist and changing bread and wine into his Body and Blood and telling us: "Do this in memory of me". He washed his disciples' feet showing humble service and, giving us a New Commandment "to love one another". The Mass ends with a procession to the Altar of Repose and there will be silent prayer in Church for an hour to share with Jesus, in Agony in the Garden, as he asked his disciples "could you not pray for one hour with me"

On Good Friday we have the remembrance of Jesus sufferings and death on the Cross, and his laying down his life in sacrifice to take away the sins of the world

At the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday and Easter Sunday, we rejoice in Christ's victory over sin, suffering and death, in his glorious resurrection. We Christians, whether at home or away, should make special efforts to take part in the Holy Week and Easter Services. This is the holiest week in the year when we celebrate God's love for us, and the new life of grace he gives us through Christ.

May Christ's sufferings and death touch our hearts and minds. Fr John
