#### 1<sup>st</sup> May 2022

Dear Friends and Parishioners,

Three times, Jesus asked Peter, "Do you love me?" (John 21:1-19). People who have doubts or are insecure in a relationship may ask their spouse or partner, "Do you love me?" as they seek reassurance from the other about their commitment. Jesus was not insecure but in asking Peter three times, "Do you love me" gave him the opportunity to make a threefold profession of his love following the three times he denied our Lord. Peter, was a man of great heart and enthusiastic commitment to Jesus, felt hurt at the Lord's questions and thought Jesus should know that he loved him. Then Jesus placed his trust in Peter by giving him pastoral responsibility for his people as he said to him, "Feed my lambs. Look after my sheep". Down through the ages, in Catholic tradition, we see the Pope as the successor of St Peter inheriting that pastoral responsibility to "Confirm the faith of his brothers and sisters" and maintain the unity of Christ's Body, the church.

In our reading from Acts 5 we see how Peter and the apostles are prosecuted and suffered for their witness to Christ and his death and resurrection. Peter's response then was not to deny or run away from Jesus, as he did when the Lord was arrested, but to testify to the truth based on the principle "that obedience to God comes before obedience to men". In our time there are millions of Christians and conscientious people of faith throughout the world who are suffering discrimination, imprisonment, torture and death for their faithfulness to God and to the truth. We remember them and support them with our prayers and pray also for the wisdom and strength for ourselves that we may put "Obedience to God before obedience to men" in our thoughts, words and actions, and so bear faithful witness to Christ.

It was good at Easter to see that we had the largest number of people attend Sunday Masses since the lockdown two years ago. As we now go about "normally" (whatever that is!), it is right that we should come together in church for Mass with God's people. If we can work, shop or socialise then we can also come together to pray, to be guided by the Lord's Word, and to be strengthened by receiving him and his grace in Holy Communion. *May the Risen Christ bless us with the joy of new life this Easter.
