Dear Friends and Parishioners,

Jesus said, "My little children, I shall not be with you much longer. I give you a new commandment: love one another; just as I have loved you, you must love one another" (Jn.13:31-35). Many people prepare to leave life, by making their will and stating their wishes for those who are special to them. Jesus was doing that in today's Gospel, as he told his followers that he will be taken from them and wishes them to live the "new commandment; to love one another as I have loved you".

Jesus sets love as the quality by which his followers will be recognised in their commitment to God and each other. He says, "By this love you have for one another, everyone will know that you are my disciples". Everyone wants to love and be loved, but a love that follows the example of Christ requires sacrifices and must be total and without conditions. Jesus said; "even the pagans love and do good to those who do good to them, in expectation of a reward". We can fool ourselves when on judging the quality of our love and be blinded by self-interest.

St Ignatius of Loyola gives us a wonderful prayer of Christian love, which is printed inside the back cover of our Parish Mass Book, in the Prayers after Communion. We should use this prayer often:

"Lord, teach us to be generous; to serve you as you desire; to give and not to count the cost; to fight and not to heed the wounds; to toil and not to seek for rest; to labour and not to seek reward, save that of knowing we do your will, through Christ, our Lord".

Jesus showed his perfect love, by sacrificing his life out of love for his Father and sinful people. In his Word and the Sacraments, he brings the love of God to us and calls us to live in love of God and each other. St Paul gives us an agenda for love and life in his two great Christian hymns to love; in 1Corinthians 13:1-13 and Colossians 3:1-17. We could use these for prayer, reflection and examination of conscience. They will help us grow in love for God and one another.
