#### Dear Friends & Parishioners,

St Paul wrote to Timothy: 'My advice is that prayers should be offered for everyone: petitions, intercessions and thanksgiving – and especially for kings and others in authority, so that we may be able to live religious and reverent lives in peace and quiet' (1Tim.2:1-8). This instruction from Paul is appropriate for all of us, at this time, as the country mourns the death of the Queen, and the King begins his reign, and there is a new Government. Paul says that offering prayers for those entrusted with high office and responsibilities for people, "is right and will please God our Saviour, who wants everyone to be saved and reach full knowledge of the truth".

He calls us to lift up our "hands reverently in prayer with no anger or arguments". He gives direction on how we contribute to the well being of the nation and people, by offering prayer and spiritual support to those who have responsibilities for the good and wellbeing of people. He advises against anger and arguments, which are often expressed between people who hold opposing political views. The late Queen was seen as wise and above politics, which may be one of the reasons she was seen as a unifying figurehead for the whole country.

Our bishops have produced a lovely prayer card, with a portrait of the Queen, and prayers for the repose of her soul, the consolation of the Royal Family, and prayer for King Charles in the exercise of his high office. Please take and use it to pray for the Queen's soul, as we would for one of our own family, in their journey from a kingdom in this world to the kingdom of God in the next world, "for it is a holy and a wholesome thought to pray for the dead that they may be released from their sins" (Maccabees 12). We should also pray for the King and those have the responsibility of government that they may work for the common good, at home and abroad. *May the Lord, the King of Kings, bless all of us with charity and wisdom.
