# THIRTIETH SUNDAY - ORDINARY TIME C23rd October 2022Dear Friends and Parishioners,

Jesus spoke a parable to "people who prided themselves on being virtuous and despised everyone else" (Luke 18:9-14). In the parable of the Pharisee and tax collector Jesus shows the effects of spiritual blindness, that comes from pride – a sin. People committed to the practice of religion or involved in a professionally in religion can be in danger of thinking that fulfilling their duties to God and people justifies them. Yet nothing is further from the truth; for we are justified by faith and saved by God's grace, that is given to us through Jesus Christ.

Some who pride themselves in their devotion to God or people may be tempted to think they are morally superior to others who seem to give little or no time to the worship of God or caring for people. Jesus teaches us the importance of recognising one's own personal imperfections so that we can truly say, "We are unworthy servants and we have only done what was our duty" (Lk.17:10).

Humility on the other hand, leads to a conscious dependence on God and people and stops one from becoming proud. "The prayer of the humble man pierces the clouds" (Eccl.35:12-19) and we say in response to Psalm 33 today: "This poor (or humble) man called and the Lord heard him". When we come before the Lord or other people, we need to do so with humility, not pride or superiority, for it is a blessing to recognise how much we depend on God's grace and people's love. We should constantly thank God for all that he and other people do for us. God has forgiven and saved us from our sins, failings and folly; we must then be humble and grateful to him, as we say with the Psalmist; "I praise you, Lord, you have rescued me; you, have not let my enemies rejoice over me"(Psalm 30).

Today, World Mission Sunday, we think of Christ's command to his disciples, "Go and make disciple of all nations, and baptise them in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teach them to observe all that I have commanded you" (Matthew 28:19). We think and pray for missionaries and all who spread the Gospel and give witness to Christ, often in foreign and hostile places, where they suffer for witnessing to Christ and carrying out his commands. We especially welcome Fr Patrick O'Bernie of the Columban Missionaries to our parish this weekend and support their missionary work and missions with our prayers and our generous giving in the retiring collection at all Masses.

May the Lord bless each of us with a humble and contrite heart. Fr John
