THIRTY-FIRST SUNDAY - ORDINARY TIME C 30th October 2022

Dear Friends and Parishioners,

"The Lord supports all who fall and raises up all who are bowed down" (Ps.144). Judgement and condemnation casts people down and diminishes their ability to make a new start or go forward in life. St Paul wrote, "there is no condemnation for people living in relationship with Christ" (Romans 8:1). Through Christ, God gives people freedom and peace by forgiving their and our sins, and setting them and us free, from the effects of sin – judgement, guilt and condemnation.

The Gospel shows us the change that a conversion can bring about in the lives of people who look to Jesus and respond to his call. Jesus noticed Zacchaeus, as he notices those who are excluded from and rejected by society. He honoured a man, who was despised and condemned as a sinner by others and visited his house where he declared that God's "salvation, has come to this house, today (Luke 19:1-10).

In the structure of our Scripture readings at Sunday Mass, the Psalm is the link between the Old Testament and Gospel reading. Today we see the approach God takes to his people by being compassionate, slow to anger, always faithful and loving, "supporting all who fall and raising up all who are bowed down" (Ps.144). If we really understood those qualities coming to us from God through Christ, we would be looking out for the Lord, listening for and to his word, and responding to his call with great confidence and hope, joy and happiness.

On Tuesday, we celebrate the Feast of All Saints, when we remember and rejoice with the humble and holy of this world, who have gone before us to the Lord and now share in the joy and perpetual light of his presence. They are the anonymous and good people of this world who have been taken up into the glory and love of God's kingdom, where they are in peace and share in the vision of God.

On Wednesday, All Souls Day, as it is called, we remember and pray for all who have died and are still being purified or purged, so that they may be worthy to enter into the glory of God. In Catholic tradition we pray for the souls of those who have died to assist them in that journey. The importance of this may be missed in "Services to Celebrate the Life of..." instead of "praying for the soul of". St Thomas More said, "Pray for me, as I for thee, that we may happily meet in heaven" and St Monica said to her son, St Augustine, "All I ask is that you pray for me at the altar of God". May we be inspired by their words to follow their example in prayer. *May we thank the Lord our Saviour for his mercy and forgiving love. Fr John*
