THIRTY-THIRD SUNDAY - ORDINARY TIME C 13 November 2022

Dear Friends and Parishioners,

"The Lord is coming to judge the earth. He will judge the world with righteousness, and the peoples with his truth" (Psalm 96). As we come to the end of the liturgical year, the Church turns our attention to Christ's return as Lord and judge at the end of time. He will judge all mankind, the living and the dead, and his judgements will be true. He will judge each person, and peoples and nations, and St Paul says that everyone will have to stand before the judgement seat of Christ. He will judge people according to the way they lived their lives and the whole truth of the life of each one of us will be revealed before him.

Jesus will come at the end the world as we know it, and he will offer to his Father a renewed and redeemed creation as a sacrifice acceptable to God. He prophesied that before the time of judgement and redemption, terrible events will distress creation and people. Individuals who are faithful to God will be persecuted, but perseverance in faith, hope and love will save them and win them their lives. In natural disasters we see violence in nature, and in wars and conflicts, we see people inflict sufferings on each other. We think and pray about the sufferings in Ukraine at present —a time of darkness. Jesus tells us not to lose faith or hope in tribulations, for God is always with his people, in their joys and sufferings, to save them.

Today, Remembrance Sunday, we remember, commemorate and pray for all who died for peace, justice and human rights in the two World Wars and subsequent conflicts. The local War Memorial honours local people who sacrificed their lives, or whose lives were sacrificed for the good of others. The Act of Remembrance brings to us in the present what happened in the past and makes us aware of the aspect of sacrificing one's life for the sake of freedom, moral values and true peace

Some parishioners have stepped down from roles in our parish and we thank them for their long and devoted service, but we need new people to take on these and other tasks. A good family grows when each one contributes for the good of the whole. In our parish family we have a responsibility for each other and need to make our individual contribution so that our community will grow and be a sign of God's presence. I ask you to respond to the appeals in a booklet we are now producing, and which will soon be in our church. Let us give glory to God by making our own individual contribution or sacrifice for his service by serving others.

May the Lord let the light of his face shine upon us. Fr John
