 THIRD (REJOICING) SUNDAY IN ADVENT A
 11th December 2022

Dear Friends and Parishioners,

John the Baptist, in prison, sent his disciples to Jesus to ask him, "are you the one who is to come or have we to wait for another". Jesus response was that they should tell John "what you hear and see: the blind see again, the lame walk, the lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised to life and the Good News is proclaimed to the poor" (Matthew 11:2-11). This Third Sunday of Advent is called Gaudete or Rejoicing Sunday for we see Jesus fulfilling the prophecies of the Old Testament, in his words of preaching and his actions that bring healing. We may think of rejoicing is a celebratory moment, excitement or passing happiness, but the joy that we celebrate on this Sunday is associated with the deepest and most important things in life where we seek hope and healing from Jesus, our Saviour.

Many prayers begin with the petition, "O God, come to our aid. O Lord, make haste to help us". In Advent we look forward to God coming our aid as a Saviour in the person of Jesus Christ. Jesus, as the Son of God and Son of Man, in coming into the world two thousand years ago brought joy to people then and to us today, by giving hope and healing, wholeness and new life to mankind. His response to the questions put to him by John's disciple was to say, look at the evidence before you and tell John what you have witnessed and then he will recognise the Messiah has come.

We all have our ups and downs in life, times of joy and times of testing and sadness. These are expressed in Ecclesiastes 3:1-8 that tells us that "in everything there is a season", yet God is present with and to his people in all those situations and times and especially in the most important and final moments of life. Even when we look at the Joyful Mysteries of the Rosary we see that the joy in them is tinged with fear, journeying, labour, painful prophecy and anxiety – yet the providence, hand presence and of God is working in all these situations.

Christmas is especially a time of reaching out and caring. God the Father reaches out and cares for us through Jesus, his Son. We too are called to care by reaching out to others, especially the needy and vulnerable, the refugee and asylum seeker, the outcast and stranger, at this time. Many people have needs we do not recognise, they may not call out for help and outward appearances may suggest the "are fine". People can have not only material poverty but also an inner poverty where they hunger for love, companionship or forgiveness. The greatest gift we can give to anyone at Christmas is a caring love, for it for surpasses the material.

May the Lord bless us with his joy and peace during this Advent. Fr John
