FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT: ORDINARY TIME A 26 February 2023

Dear Friends & Parishioners.

"Jesus was led by the Spirit out into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil" (Matthew 4:1-11). Today many people doubt or discount the nature and existence of God, but also dismiss the reality of temptation, evil and the devil and sin. Jesus was hungry and weak in his forty days in the wilderness but was also subjected to temptation by the devil. It is said the devil does not bother with those who are not really dedicated to doing good and God's will, as they will not better the lives of people or change the world very much, nor will they help prepare for the coming of God's kingdom, as we pray for it to come the in Lord's Prayer.

Jesus had three temptations presented to him by the devil that went to the heart of his mission and work, for they centred on self. First, to work a miracle for his own benefit as he needed food. Second, a temptation to do something attention seeking but foolish, and expect God to send angels to rescue him. Third a temptation to obtain power and exercise control over peoples and nations by selling his soul. Later in his teachings, Jesus said, "What will it profit a man if he gain the whole world and lose his soul" (Mark 8:36). Jesus, in physical weakness had the spiritual strength, to rebuff the temptations, "the devil left him to return" (Luke 4:13).

Genesis Ch2:7-3:7 tells us temptation exists from the beginning and is centred on self and self-exaltation. Adam and Eve desired to elevate themselves to be like god, by disobeying and ignoring the command of the God who created them. Each of us has our own temptations – some come from the devil, some from our inner self and some from the world. We are more like our first parents than Jesus in dealing with temptations. Jesus told his disciples, "I am sending you out like sheep among wolves but be wise as serpents and gentle as doves" (Matt 10:16).

During Lent we are called to journey with Jesus in the wilderness of our life – not alone but with him. He is our source of wisdom, who enables us to see our life as it really is. He is our strength who helps us resist the temptations that come from world, our own nature and the devil. Above all he is the Saviour who has been to the wilderness and redeems us and forgives us, when fall into sin.

May the Lord bless us with a grace-filled and holy Lent. Fr John
