Dear Friends & Parishioners,

Jesus came up and walked by the side of the disciples but something prevented them from recognising him. He asked, "What matters are you discussing as you walk along?" (Luke 24:13-35). On Easter Sunday evening the disciples talked as they walked to Emmaus about their grief and bereavement on their loss and death of Jesus, though he as risen Lord was walking with them, but they did not recognise him. As a good counsellor, he asked them to tell him all that had happened over the past few days. Their expectation that he would found a new kingdom of Israel had been shattered by his crucifixion and death. They were confused by the women saying, "They had seen a vision of angels who declared he was alive". Jesus lets them express their pain and confusion; he listened to them and draws out how they felt by asking them questions. By explaining the scriptures, he helped them understand God's plan, and after recognising him in the "Breaking of the Bread" they said, "did not our hearts burn within us as he talked to us on the road".

This Gospel gives us a model that can help families, friends or ourselves as we go through bereavement or troublesome and anxious times in life. We need friends to listen to us and our problems, who will walk with us at painful times on our journey through life. They can help us to see and understand God's plan in difficult or sad situations. Many find the meditation "Footprints" helpful as it shows Christ accompanying us as a friend on our journey through life, in good times and bad. We may not always recognise that he is with us but he never abandons us in the most difficult or darkest moments. The Word of God, which a person may share with us at testing times, can be like a beam of sunlight piercing the clouds of mist or sadness, when we feel oppressed or downcast. In sharing the Word of God with others or their sharing his Word with us, it can be like Christ speaking and giving understanding, comfort or guidance in difficult or sad circumstances. That is why we need to listen to, read and share the Word of God with sensitivity and wisdom.

I again thank you so much for your Easter greetings and very generous Offerings at the Easter Vigil and on Easter Sunday. We now look forward to the first Holy Communion of the children in our parish next month. We pray that the Lord will greatly bless them and they progress in their faith journey to receive our Lord, whom we and they recognise in "The Breaking of the Bread", Holy Communion.

May we recognise the Lord accompanying us through life and be attentive to his Word as he speaks to us on our faith journey. Fr John
