TWELFTH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME A 25th June 2023

Dear Friends & Parishioners.

Jesus said, "Do not be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul; fear him rather who can destroy both body and soul in hell" (Matt.10:26-33). Jesus uses the phrase, "Do not be afraid" many times to reassure his disciples. In today's Gospel he says "Do not be afraid" in order to reassure people and us of how precious we are before God and the fact that each one of us and every part of us in treasured by God, our Creator and loving Father. He focuses on the fact the God has created us in love and that he never withdraws his love and never fails us.

On Thursday we celebrate the feast of St Peter and St Paul, two apostles who gave their lives in witnessing to Christ and the Gospel. Our reading from Jeremiah 20 speaks of the person who is tempted and tested in dreadful ways but continues to place their trust in God and hopes he will answer them (Ps 68). These two apostles, and martyrs down through the ages, placed their trust in God and with the power of the Spirit were faithful to Christ and the mission he gave them. The Psalmist cries out to God in time of persecution or distress and asks God to answer him with compassion and love. So too with ourselves, or those we know, love and care for, we call out to the Lord to rescue, save and protect us from the attack of the enemy.

The Lord called Peter and Paul to follow him and carry out his mission in the world. They were amazed at the wonderful things they achieved in his name. When we follow Jesus' call of by obeying him and listening to him, great things happen that transform our lives and the lives of others. Whether we are young, middle aged or old, poor or rich, healthy or sick; weak or strong, educated or illiterate, married or single, widowed or divorced, the Lord calls us to, "Follow me". God loves each of us and Jesus calls us to "Follow me". He says, "If anyone wants to be a follower of mine, let him renounce himself and take up his cross daily and follow me".

New appointments for priests in our Diocese are due to be made this week and a new parish priest should be appointed and announced for Epping. Over two years ago, I offered my resignation as parish priest to Bishop Alan as required by church law, and he asked me to stay on for two years in a row. I am due to retire at the beginning of September when a new parish priest takes over. This parish needs new vision, energy and a fresh restart. May the Lord who has started and sustains his good work here bring it to new growth and a blessed fulfilment.

May the Lord in his compassion and love turn to us and bless us. Fr John
