 THE TRANSFIGURATION OF OUR LORD (A)
 6th August 2023

Dear Friends & Parishioners,

On this Feast of the Transfiguration of Our Lord, the readings speak to us of the Glory of God.

The first reading from the Book of Daniel gives us good news; the judgement of world powers, the deliverance of the people of God and the coming of the Kingdom.

In the second reading, we have the testimony of the Apostle of Peter. He made it clear that his messages are not out of some wishful or imaginary thinking. He powerfully stressed the authenticity of his testimony: "We have been eye-witnesses of his majesty". Peter says and again "we ourselves heard his voice". We Christians of today believe in Jesus transfigured and resurrected because we have confidence in the testimony of those who saw his glory.

With the Gospel we can go into the event of the Transfiguration. Our Lord took with him Peter, James and John to a high mountain. In the Bible the mountain is the privileged place of meeting the Lord God closely. There, the Apostles will discover the Lord transfigured into light, his face shining like the sun. Peter was dazzled, he was much captivated, he wanted to stay there forever, contemplating this extraordinary vision.

Then the voice of the father would come in; "This is my beloved son in who I am well pleased; listen to him."

We, the disciples of Christ, we are called to be the people that listen to his voice and take his word to heart. To listen to Jesus, we have to be close to him, to follow him, accept his teaching, which is in the Gospels and we are sent to be witnesses and messengers of the hope that gives us life.
