THE NINETEENTH SUNDAY OF THE YEAR (A) 13th August 2023

Dear Friends in Christ,

The readings of today are inviting us to move further in our desire for conversion and discover more who God is to us.

Elijah, in the first reading, has just killed the prophets of the false gods, his life is in danger, he has walked for 40 days and 40 nights to get to the mountain of God, Horeb (the Sinai) where he would now realise he was mistaken about God. On the mountain he would now know that God is not some powerful violence but that of love. He discovered him in this "tiny whispering sound". Our Lord Jesus will later reveal to us a God of love and mercy. It is in loving that we know the reality and the truth about God.

Paul too, in the second reading, must have been mistaken about God. He violently persecuted the Christians, thinking that he was defending God's honour until the day he met Christ on the road to Damascus. This encounter with Christ was the turning point in his life; the real conversion. He reminds Christians that the Jews gave us Christ, the Jews are part of God's plan of salvation. He would also express his pain for the lack of faith of the Jews in Jesus Christ, whom we see today walking on the sea.

He had just fed the 5,000 men, not counting women and children; he has sent the disciples away to pray by himself on the mountain and to be with God. He now comes down to walk on the water to meet his disciples battling with the waves. He, Christ, the Lord of all, will calm the sea to save those he has chosen and loved. He comes to us in all our problems and battles in life. When we are in difficulties, he is near to us. He is there even when we ignore him.
