## "Peace be with you!"

In the midst of the joy and exuberance of Easter, this Sunday's readings allow us to consider our sinfulness, our doubts and our weakness. This is not to weigh us down, but to bring us peace and encourage us to live the new life won for us.

In the First Reading from the Acts of the Apostles, Peter is gentle with those responsible for the death of the 'Prince of life'. They must now turn back to God.

The Psalm is both a cry for help and a song of hope and trust. John, in the Second Reading, speaks of Christ as our Advocate with the Father. Not only does he take our sins away, he fills us with God's love.

Jesus appears to his doubting disciples in the Gospel. He reassures them by inviting them to touch him and by eating with them, before increasing their understanding and hinting at their mission.

Let us continue our Lenten journey this week, strengthened by the gift of Christ's peace, and conscious of being his witnesses - even if, at times, we are confused and doubtful.

AFRICAN PALMS: On Palm Sunday the palm branches we blessed came from the Masasi people in Tanzania, Africa. African Palms, is a charity founded by Rev Alan Talbot RIP, an Anglican priest from Leyton, to help Masasi people make Palm branches into crosses to fund projects for street children, HIV \& special needs children, to provide clean water, agriculture projects, health clinics, and schools.
HOMES FOR UKRAINE: "So far, the Catholic community in England and Wales have responded very generously, with many Ukrainian people now living here, miles away from the war zone. As of March 2024, our project has successfully matched 139 guests, and this shortly set to rise with the approval of more visas in the next few weeks. We have also indirectly supported more than 300 people through webinars and offline events. However, the need is still great. The number of families still waiting to find a home is over 2000. Hosting displaced people is a great way to learn about different cultures and build new friendships.
