The Baptism of the Lord

11th January 2015

Dear friends,

today we keep the feast of our Lord's Baptism. This event is attested in three of the four gospels whereas his birth is only accounted for in two of them. It marked the beginning of his public ministry and designated him as the Beloved Son of God to whom we are to listen. The Sacrament of Baptism also marks the beginning of our own Christian journey and through the Holy Spirit empowers us to fulfil our calling to be **messengers** and **missionaries** for Christ. In my jubilee homily just before Christmas I emphasised that the laity share in the priesthood of the Lord through the grace of baptism. The ordained priest has a special role within the believing community but he must never underestimate, still less eclipse, the gifts of the whole people. Together we priests and people are called to service like the master we follow. Jesus came "not to be served but to serve". A parish will thrive to the extent that each and every baptised son or daughter of God has a clear vision of service; service of God for his greater glory and service of one another for the common good.

Very soon we shall be observing the annual week of prayer for Christian unity. The other Christian churches in our neighbourhood share the call to service and mission and it is good that from time to time we should come together to pray with them. To that end we shall be hosting a unity service on Monday 19th January. Please give it your support.
