The Immaculate Conception

Third Sunday of the Year

25th January 2015

Dear friends,

in this year of 2015 the gospel readings at Sunday Mass are taken from St Mark which is the earliest and the shortest of all four gospels. Right at the beginning Mark goes to the core of Jesus' preaching: the closeness of the Kingdom of God and the call to repent and believe. Repent is a key word for a proper understanding of the Scriptures. To repent is to think again and, having done so, to come to a change of heart. Repentance leads to conversion. You may remember that the psalm response last week was: *here I am Lord, I come to do your will*. This week it is something similar: *Lord make me know your ways*. To know the ways of the Lord and to do his will entails a frequent and honest examination of our hearts and minds. One of the hymns we sing contains the line: *the Kingdom of God is challenge and choice*. If we allow God to work in our lives we are indeed challenged to review our attitudes and to choose things that often demand sacrifice and not an easy option. In today's second reading St Paul reminds us that the ways of the world are transient. In proclaiming the Kingdom Jesus teaches us that the ways of Our Lord God are forever.

We offer prayerful condolences to Mr John Black, who has served on the altar here for many years, on the death of his father Mr Les Black. May he rest in peace.
