FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT **20th December 2015**

Dear friends,

one of the most powerful themes running through the letters of St Paul is that of the ***obedience of faith***. It is a theme that resonates strongly in today's readings. Mary believed in the promises made to her and responded obediently in faith: ***let what you have said be done to me***. Jesus, also obeys his heavenly Father: ***I am coming to obey your will***. The obedience of faith stands in direct contradiction to the original sin of pride. Pride is a refusal to obey God and all the woes of human history can be ascribed to it. When we examine our conscience and our conduct we have to ask ourselves how often have I preferred to follow my own agenda rather than do what God asks of me? The obedience of faith is powerfully exercised through the Sacrament of Reconciliation. For those who have yet to celebrate that great expression of God's mercy there will be a further opportunity on Christmas Eve when confessions will be heard from 11am to 12 noon.

As we celebrate Christmas we must keep in mind our brothers and sisters in the Middle East as they endure a constant and virulent assault in their freedom to worship. We pray that their faith may be steadfast in these troubled times.

BOXING DAY: Please take note that the 6pm Saturday Mass will take place as usual but there will be no Mass in the morning.

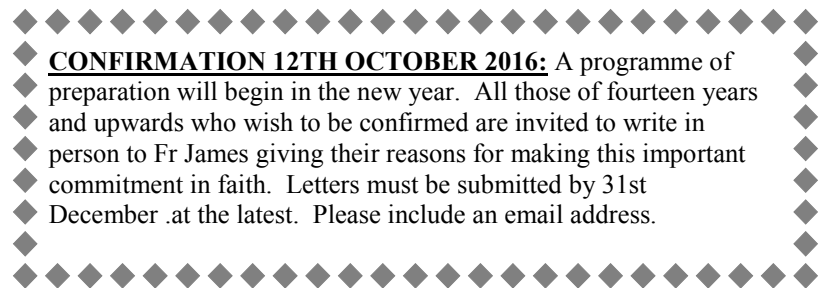

USED SPECTACLES. A reminder that we have a **Used Spectacles Box in the bookcase in the Church Porch**. When you no longer need a pair of spectacles, they can be used in the developing world. The spectacles we collect are sent to a prison in UK, where they are checked by qualified prisoners (!!!), catalogued and sent overseas for use by people who would otherwise remain poor-sighted. It's a very **worthwhile action of charity and is commended for your thoughtful generosity**. The box is available in the Church Porch throughout the year.
