Dear friends,

an ominous statistic was published recently which showed that non believers now outnumber Christians in this country for the first time. Make no mistake about it , we are living in a secular state. Catholics, practising and lapsed, amount to just 8.3 of the population. The rapid decline in our own numbers of regular mass attenders seemingly reflects a general pattern. However, we must firmly reject any temptation to despondency, still less despair. Those who really believe that Jesus is Lord and that He is constantly with his Church must continue to persevere despite the signs of the times. Our weekly Mass, at which we listen to God's word and nourish ourselves on the Bread of Life, equips us spiritually for our journey of faith. I constantly reflect on some words written by St Paul, at a time of fierce persecution, during the reign of the Emperor Nero. Paul says to the Christians of Rome: ***Since God is with us, who is against us? Rom.8.31.*** God is indeed with us so ultimately we are on the winning side.

I am due for my second cataract procedure next Thursday and am advised that I should take it easy the following weekend 11/12 June. It is proving increasingly difficult to find priestly cover: in the event of failing to do so Bishop Alan has authorised Deacon Duncan to conduct Eucharistic Services instead.

**Epping St John's School Year 8 Worship Experience – Friday 17<sup>th</sup> June – volunteers needed 9am-11am**

The annual Year 8 Worship Experience will be taking place this year on Friday 17<sup>th</sup> June in St John's Church. During this event, arranged by the Chaplaincy Team at Epping St John's School, 180 students aged 12-13 years will be visiting St John's Church for the morning to take part in the 'Worship Labyrinth', a series of approx 20 stations with interactive activities lasting 3 mins each that encourages them to think about the world, their place in it, God's promises in the Bible and what they believe. They will then take part in a short time of collective worship.

We need approx 30 adult volunteers from across the churches to help us run this event. We need people who are prepared to follow simple instructions to facilitate groups of 7-8 students to take part in one of the 3 min interactive activities. This will need to be repeated for each group of students over about 1 hour 15 mins. You will need to be able to arrive in church by 9am on the Friday and be able to stay until 11am (or maybe 11:15 if things overrun slightly).
