THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK

At his best, King David (1st Reading) was generous and devoted, loving and warm-hearted, but his whole reign was tarnished by his adultery and the murder he arranged to hide it...but when he was finally found out, he repented. This theme of sin and forgiveness connects the 1st Reading with today's Gospel. The woman described in the Gospel as 'having a bad name in the town' came to Jesus and displayed her sorrow for her sins in the dramatic way of washing his feet with her tears.

King David had repented because he was found out, whereas the woman with a bad name made a conscious and free decision to admit her guilt and ask for forgiveness. Both were forgiven by God.

How often do we stop to think of the ways in which we offend God by sinning? Do we travel our road of life with frequent reflection on the sins we commit before God (large and small) and ask God's help to correct them? Or do we fall into the trap of thinking that the way in which we lead our lives is absolutely normal in today's world and acceptable to God and that we are 'doing our best to lead good lives in the circumstances'?

Whether we sin in a major way (mortal sin) or in a minor way (venial sin), we can be sure that our loving and merciful God is ready and eager to help us to 'break the habit'. But this will require a major commitment on our part.

May God bless us all as we struggle to please him at all times and in all ways.

We wish Fr James a speedy recovery to good health after his recent surgery.

Epping St John's School Year 8 Worship Experience – Friday 17th June – volunteers needed 9am-11am

The annual Year 8 Worship Experience will be taking place this year on Friday 17th June in St John's Church. During this event, arranged by the Chaplaincy Team at Epping St John's School, 180 students aged 12-13 years will be visiting St John's Church for the morning to take part in the 'Worship Labyrinth', a series of approx 20 stations with interactive activities lasting 3 mins each that encourages them to think about the world, their place in it, God's promises in the Bible and what they believe. They will then take part in a short time of collective worship.

We need approx 30 adult volunteers from across the churches to help us run this event. We need people who are prepared to follow simple instructions to facilitate groups of 7-8 students to take part in one of the 3 min interactive activities. This will need to be repeated for each group of students over about 1 hour 15 mins. You will need to be able to arrive in church by 9am on the Friday and be able to stay until 11am (or maybe 11:15 if things overrun slightly).
