THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK

Today's readings present us with a direct challenge to look at the honesty and integrity of all our dealings measured against the standards of good Christian living. There will be many who will feel comfortable with this challenge, because they are always 100% honest in their dealings with others and with God and can be depended upon to respond to every situation with complete integrity. So be it, but a review can often be helpful.

As today's first reading spells out, our honesty and integrity are measured not only in money-terms, but in the way in which we deal with others. The prophet Amos reminds us that exploitation of others, in whatever form, has to be avoided in all our dealings, so as not to displease God..

In the second reading, Timothy focuses on our commitment to God and encourages us to practise prayerful devotion in ways that will always please God...another aspect of honesty and integrity!

And then, we hear the parable of the rich man and his steward. At first reading, we may believe that the steward was being dishonest when he gave significant discounts to the debtors, but on closer reading, we can see that the reductions given to the debtors will have been his normal commission and therefore were his to give away, if he wished, in the interests of his future relationships. But we can question whether he had been deficient in the management of his master's affairs and therefore had become 'wasteful with his property'...another example of how easy it is to offend God through our inefficiency or lack of endeavour.

In worldly terms, it is not easy being a Christian! Our first responsibility is always to please God. In doing this there may be a conflict with what society at large allows of us. However, we need to ensure that our dealings, including those at the margins of life, are all good, honest and trustworthy.
