SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT (Year A) 4th December 2016

Dear Friends,

St John the Baptist preached “Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is close at hand” (Matthew 3:1-12). A sense of expectancy had arisen amongst the people that something new was going to happen when John started preaching and calling people to repent of their sins. They showed repentance and a conversion to God by being baptised in the river Jordan. John the Baptist was confrontational in his approach and condemned those who did not live in good relationship with God or people. He said, “If you are repentant, produce the fruits of repentance”, which are good works, right relationships and good moral living.

If St John the Baptist were preaching today, his approach would be no different for he would confront us with the ways we compromise and fail to live according to God’s law. His message would be considered dated, and he would be “a voice crying in the wilderness, prepare a way for the Lord, make his paths straight” to people who do not want to hear or believe his message. He would call on us to listen to and obey God’s word. John’s call to repentance is addressed to each of us. In Advent we are called to prepare a way for the Lord to come into our life by examining our conscience, confessing our sins and asking him for mercy and forgiveness. We have many opportunities during Advent, to receive the Lord’s forgiveness in the Sacrament of Penance or Reconciliation. If you have not been to this Sacrament for some time, it is essential to prepare spiritually for Christmas and to receive Holy Communion by turning to God for mercy and forgiveness.

Welcoming people is a part of being a good Christian. St Paul tells us to “make hospitality (or welcoming) your special concern” (Roman 12:13). Parish meetings often discuss the importance of welcoming people to Church and our Parish community. This is especially important at Christmas for people who may not have been to Church for some time. Our Bishops suggest we invite people who no longer come to Mass to “Come home for Christmas”. We invite them to their and our spiritual home in the Church, to join the Lord’s family in celebrating his birth at Christmas. **God Bless you. Fr John**

Some may be contacted to discuss the reference for their child. Families where parents and children are not practising their faith and do not attend Sunday Mass consistently, should make their application directly to the school but not request a priest's reference unless there are extraordinary circumstances in their situation. It is essential that integrity and truth are fully respected in this process.
