THE BODY & BLOOD OF CHRIST (A) 18th June 2017

My dear People,

"Every time you eat this bread and drink this cup you are proclaiming the death of the Lord, until he comes" (1Cor.11:23-26). St Paul was not at the Last Supper with Christ and the apostles, nor was he a follower of Jesus until his conversion. Yet, he gives the most detailed account of what happened at the Passover Meal when Christ offered up his life as a sacrifice to take away the sins of the world. At the time of the Reformation, and even today, there is a controversy between Christians about the nature of the Last Supper and the Mass. In the Mass, the Last Supper - Christ's last meal at which he sacrificed his life – is made present to us here and now.

Jesus and his disciples at the Last Supper commemorated the Passover Meal when God delivered his people from slavery in Egypt to freedom and a new life in the Promised Land. He transformed an Old Testament meal, which had a spotless lamb at its centre, whose blood was shed to save the people from death, by offering his life as the Lamb of God in the New Testament. His blood was shed to take away the sins of the world and he offered his life as a sacrifice to give us the new life of grace and eternal life with God. The unleavened bread of Exodus, he changed into his body, the bread of life, as he gives himself to us as Holy Communion. He took the cup of wine and blessed it and gave it to us as his blood, through which our sins are forgiven. What Jesus did at the Last Supper enables us to pass-over the obstacles of life and enter into a Holy Communion with him, in the new life of grace. The Body of Christ is given to us as food for eternal life, and his Blood washes away our sins.

Friday next is the feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, whose human heart showed the love and compassion of God for people. He gives us an example of the humble and gentle heart of God, inviting us to come close to him. In times past people had their homes blessed or dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Priests still bless people's homes when requested, and I always pray in a home when visiting. In asking God to bless a house, person or family we seek his love and protection for people and pray that his spirit of love will live and be truly present in their homes and their hearts.

May God bless and protect you and yours. Fr John
