**FOURTEENTH SUNDAY of ORDINARY TIME A 9<sup>th</sup> July 2017**

***My dear parishioners,***

Jesus said, "Come to me all you who labour and are heavily burdened and I will give you rest. Shoulder my yoke and learn from me for I am gentle and humble of heart, and you will find rest for your souls" (Matt.11:25-30). Jesus shared people's joys, sorrows and burdens. Sometimes, when life is hardest and most burdensome we can feel most alone. At such times we most need and value the support the Lord's gives us through people. Jesus shows us in today's Gospel, that we should not withdraw into our shell trying to cope with the difficulties of life, but move towards him who will strengthen us in our weakness and bear our burdens with us. He tells us, "If anyone will come after me, let him take up his cross daily and follow me". Our responsibilities and duties are mostly welcome challenges and joys, but at times can be burdens or even a kind of crucifixion. Jesus lived in faithfulness to his Father's will and prayed, "Father, not my will but thine be done". He, who was gentle and humble shares our burdens and calls us to find rest for our souls in him.

This leads us to question how do we cope with the stresses and difficulties of life. Do we see Christ having a real part in our life and do we turn to him when we are in difficulty or in need of help? If we do not bring our problems to him with faith and believe he can help to change our situation, then we are not really recognising him as the Saviour. We see the constant example of Jesus turning in prayer to his Father before making big decisions, teaching or miracles. He needed the help and guidance of his Father at those important times in life. We, with our limitations and human weaknesses, we too need God's help even more if we are to live wisely and well. Let us turn to Christ each day, especially as we say the Lord's Prayer, and ask that his will may be done in us and for us, so that we share our Cross with him. By the power of his Cross, with which we are blessed, he will be our Lord and Saviour supporting and comforting us, especially in the most difficult times of life.

We are most grateful to our teams of Catechists who prepare children and young people for First Reconciliation, Holy Communion and Confirmation. We urgently need some more and new Catechists for this important task in September.

**CHURCH CLEANING TEAMS:** We are most grateful to all parishioners who responded to a call join a team for a weekly cleaning of our church. In most parishes, the parishioners do the cleaning. Just as we clean our homes, so in a sense we would want to clean our church where we are at home with God. Another reason for this is that our parish expenditure exceeds income, There has been a trend of reduction in parish income for the past three years. For a start, by doing our own church cleaning we reduce our costs by £2,300 a year, which is a significant first step to improve our situation.
