**THE FEAST OF THE TRANSFIGURATION OF OUR LORD 6<sup>th</sup> August 2017**

Dear friends,

Today, we celebrate the Feast of the Transfiguration. Jesus takes Peter, James and John up the high mountain where the glory of His destiny is revealed to them (Mark 9:2–10). This moment is given to them to help them realize the true identity of Jesus. They see Him in conversation with Elijah and Moses. Jesus is the fulfillment of the law and the prophets. His mission is not to destroy the ways in which the Father has already revealed Himself, but to bring this revelation to completion. Because they were ‘eyewitnesses of his majesty’ (2 Peter 1:16-19) they will be able, despite all of their limitations and weaknesses, to preach with such conviction and effectiveness the truth of the Risen Jesus.

The Transfiguration assures us that God gives to each of us, according to our need, our own mountaintop experiences of His love for us. Each of us has been given our own special moments and experiences of God’s grace. He has revealed His glory and goodness to us perhaps: 1) through the beauty of the natural world, or 2) through the faithful, unselfish love of our spouse, or 3) through the miracle of parenthood – of being co-creators with God of a new human life, or 4) through special miracles of grace where He has touched our hearts in unique and unmistakable ways. We must treasure these glimpses of His glory in our hearts so that they may give us strength in our trials and light in moments of darkness and hope when sin and death appear to be victors in our world.

***May our celebration of the Transfiguration open our hearts more and more to the Beloved Son of God, Jesus Christ. May we listen to Him more attentively this week as He seeks to reveal His love and His glory to us. May the knowledge of our destiny to share in His glory dismiss all fears and anxieties from our hearts. May we treasure and never take for granted the unique and special manifestations of His love for us.***
