22nd Sunday of Ordinary Times (A) 3rd September 2017

Dear friends,

Jesus said, "If anyone wants to be a follower of mine, let him renounce himself, take up his cross and follow me" (Matthew 16:21-27). The first people Jesus called to be his followers were his disciples. A disciple is one who learns from their master, and Jesus chose as his disciples fishermen who had great hearts, but little by way of the formation that comes from and education. The disciples show that they are learning from him and use the words, master, teacher and rabbi in addressing Jesus. For most of their time with the Lord, the mission and work they shared with him brought its own reward and there was great joy and hope for them and for the people.

Now, nearing the end of his work and life, Jesus prepares his disciples for his sufferings and death, which they find it impossible to accept. It is said that we can all welcome rejoice in resurrection but want to ignore or reject crucifixion. Yet, our Lord shows, there is no resurrection for him without first going through his crucifixion with its sufferings and death. Peter becomes a temptation and weakness for our the Lord, instead of being a source of support and encouragement in the fulfilling of his mission and life's through his passion and death.

Jesus gives us an invitation and a challenge to be his disciples. This does involve making sacrifices and choices to follow him as his disciples. Sometime this can be along the difficult and painful way, and at other times it can joyful and hopeful. John Bunyan in his great meditation, "Pilgrim's Progress" illustrates this so well. Sometimes life can seem to be very hard, difficult and painful for some people and families. We think of refugees and exiles, those fleeing from wars and conflicts, famines and natural disasters. In today's readings we see that Jeremiah (Ch.20:7-9), like Jesus, has trodden that path before us. We do have the promise of our Saviour, "Behold I am with you always, to the end of time" (Matthew 28:20).

Thursday last was the first anniversary of my moving here to Epping. Thank you for your welcome, kindness and help during the past year. It is not easy getting to know people, who to turn to and discern what and how to do what is best for the growth of the parish. I apologise for my mistakes and ask for your prayerful support.
