**23<sup>rd</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time (A) 10<sup>th</sup> September 2017**

*Dear friends,*

Jesus said, "If your brother sins against you, go and tell him his fault, between you and him alone" Matthew 18:15-20). Relationships between people involve not only a human but divine dimension, for they involve God who is father of all. We are all one people under God, sharing a common humanity, which unites us to one another and makes us accountable to Him. God is a good parent who wants his children to have a sense of responsibility for one another, and be united in love. Cain, a self-centred jealous man who killed his brother, Abel was the first person to question this. He denied his crime and asked God: "Am I my brother's keeper"(Genesis 4:9).

In this section of Matthew's Gospel, Jesus focuses on the difficulties people have in relationships, and gives a method for sorting problems. First, people should ask for God's help and meet face to face and try to sort out their problems together. If they do not succeed in resolving the issues they should then take one or two others along to mediate reconciliation, and if that does not succeed then get community support so that good relationships and harmony in the family in society is restored.

This process for making peace and restoring good relationships, given to us by Christ, is full of hope and contrary to the thinking of our time. Today many see the breakdown of relationships, personal failings and sins with a kind of hopelessness. People lacking in hope, instead of trying with the help of God and others to effect reconciliation and restore relationships, give up. Jesus teaches us to seek out the lost and wounded, bring back the strayed, reconcile with those with whom we have a forgiveness problem, pray for those who hurt us, forgive countless times and love one another. This is central to the mission Christ gives to his Church and one of the reasons the Gospel should be preached in every time and place. God wants us to make this a key to the way we deal with problems and difficulties in relationships - within and outside our families. By choosing to invoke God's help and follow his Way, we should be able to transform our own life and the lives of others. People will be able to forgive and reconcile, hurts will be taken away, ruptures in families will be healed, and relationships will be renewed and preserved.

***May the Lord bless us with the grace to offer and receive forgiveness. Fr John***
