FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT

18th February 2018

Dear friends,

"The Spirit drove Jesus out into the wilderness and he remained there for forty days, and was tempted by Satan. He was with the wild beasts and the angels looked after him" (Mark 1:12-15). Mark gives a forceful account of Jesus going out into the desert and being confronted and tempted by Satan. Many people naïvely deny the existence of Satan or real temptations, saying they belong to the time of Jesus and the past, and have no relevance for us today.

When of the revised Rite of Exorcism was presented in 1999, Cardinal Estavez said "the existence of the devil is not an opinion, for it belongs to Catholic faith and doctrine; the strategy of the devil is to convince people he does not exist. The devil manages to trap people and fools them by leading them to believe happiness can be found in money, power and sexual lust. He deceives men and women by persuading them they do not need God and are self-sufficient".

When Jesus was at his weakest, the devil tempted him in three ways. With the power of the Holy Spirit, Jesus rejected those temptations, and ordered the devil to go away; "but he was to return again to Christ at the appointed time". The devil tempts people in numerous ways, especially when we are weak or vulnerable, like Jesus was. He wants us to be in a state of perpetual discontent by increasing our expectations with false promises and then disappointing them. He draws people to dabble in the occult and sinful ways, eg. Tarot cards, ouija boards or spiritualism, and when they are trapped in his power or sinful ways, he seeks to run and ruin their lives. The devil seeks to destroy good relationships and people's lives, just as he sought to destroy Jesus life at the start of his public ministry.

God's power of love and good always triumphs over evil and the devil. God's purpose is to save people through Christ, who gives us the commandment to love God and love one another. Jesus was tempted and tested in the first Lent. Lent is an opportunity for us to journey with Jesus in his time of testing, so that by going through our own testing we may celebrate his victory of love at Easter.

May God bless and strengthen us in times of testing and temptation. Fr John
