THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK

Over 3000 years ago, God gave Moses the 10 Commandments of the Law, which were to be followed by all who believed that he, God, had saved the Israelites from the oppression of the Egyptians. He had allowed them to escape as a body and had divided the waters of the Red Sea to defeat the overwhelming strength of their pursuers, the Egyptians. The whole conquest was played out with great drama, demonstrating to the Israelites just how powerful was God and how they could and should worship him and depend upon them as their sole leader and inspiration in all situations.

We are descended from the Israelites. We have inherited the power, the security and the inspiration of these 10 Commandments, most of which have been enshrined in our secular law and which ensure a peaceful and loving way of life for us all. This weekend's 1st Reading lists the 10 Commandments, giving us the opportunity to review how relevant they are today and to ask ourselves whether our practices properly reflect our love of God as a first priority in our life.

Do we always recognize God as the only God and ignore any distractions which may lead us away from worshipping only him? Do we misuse God's name? Do we 'keep holy' the Sabbath Day, or do we have other 'priorities' which distract us? Do we respect our relatives and elders, particularly our parents? Do we 'kill' or harm others by ignoring the sanctity of life or through our harmful talk? Do we ignore the sacred bond of marriage and its lasting responsibilities? Do we steal or tell lies? Do we allow envy or jealousy to rule our thoughts and actions?

May God give us the grace to listen to his word and follow his call at all times.
