FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT

18th March 2018

Dear Parishioners.

"When I am lifted up from the earth, I will draw all people to myself". By these words, Jesus indicated the death he would die (John 12:20-33). We journey with Jesus in the desert in Lent, and on Good Friday go into his sufferings and death. On Palm Sunday, we celebrate his triumphant entry to Jerusalem, and in Holy Week see how worldly acclaim can quickly change into rejection, suffering and death. We should make a real effort, whether at home or away, to journey with our Lord in his sufferings and death, so that we share in his resurrection.

We Christians have the sufferings and death of Jesus before us all the time, on the Cross or Crucifix. Christ's Cross is the sign of God's sacrificial love for us, since it is through it Christ, saves us from sin and death. We receive the sign of Christ's Cross in the first moments of Christian life at Baptism, and we make that sign to bless ourselves and invoke God's protection. We receive God's blessing with the sign of the Cross, and as we look up to Christ on the Cross we pray that he will draw us and all people to himself. Whilst the Cross symbolises Christ's terrible sufferings and death, but it is the sign of hope and promise eternal life.

Some years ago in Holy Week the film, "The Passion of the Christ" had a serious impact on many people. It sought to depict the sufferings Jesus went through out of faithfulness to his mission and love for people. He did not choose easy ways but faced the realities of sin and evil and by faithfulness transformed them with love. He asks us too to transform the world, our own lives and relationships by living with sacrificial love. Love draws people to one another and to God. We need to live in divine love to grow close to God and draw people to him.

We have had some excellent Lent talks this year. Michael Duthie, of the Santa Martha Group, spoke on human trafficking and modern day slavery, which we know so little about. Last Tuesday, Chris Driscoll, the CAFOD co-ordinator in Brentwood Diocese spoke on and demonstrated our CAFOD project in Sebeya in Ethiopia. He also showed that in the last three years our parish has given £8,500 to CAFOD for aid and development projects, and emergency disaster appeals.

May God bless us and draw us closer to himself in this holy season. Fr John
