PALM SUNDAY OF THE PASSION OF THE LORD 25th March 2018

My dear friends,

As he died on the cross, Jesus cried out, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me" (Mk.14:1-15:47). It is said that one of the greatest sufferings of our Lord was feeling abandoned by God and his friends. This comes soon after his triumphant entry to Jerusalem on Palm Sunday! St Mark tells us of a joyful Sunday, the anointing of Jesus' feet, the celebration of the Passover meal with the institution of the Eucharist at the Last Supper, and his passion and death on the Cross. All these historical events God makes present to us in the celebration of the Mass and the ceremonies of Holy Week.

Holy Week is a sacred time when Christians celebrate God's love for people. It is through his love, that Christ saves people from sin and death. He draws people who may have little or no connection with the Church to himself in this holy season. People sense a need to worship God and to be involved in Christian life, even if it is for a short time. They recognise something wonderful has happened, as God touches us in a special way through Christ, the Saviour.

In Holy Week Christ went from exaltation to humiliation and desolation. Yet, his obedience to the will of his Father was total and he shows everyone how to live according to God's plan. Commitment to God can cost us a lot when we put God's will before our own. Christ sacrificed and we too need to sacrifice our own desires in order to put God first. Throughout his life, Jesus remained faithful even when he felt abandoned. His final actions and words were of forgiveness for those who caused him terrible sufferings; as he said on the Cross, "Father, forgive them for they know not what they do".

Jesus, by his sufferings and death brought forgiveness to people in sin, and he transformed the evil that causes suffering. His resurrection offers eternal life and gives people a share in God's glory. In his agony in the Garden Jesus asked his disciples to watch and pray with him. He asks us too to watch and pray with him on Holy Thursday, Good Friday and at Easter. Since he loved us so much, we should love him in return by watching and praying with him in Holy Week.

May Christ bless us and draw us closer to himself in this Holy Week. Fr John
