EASTER SUNDAY THE RESURRECTION of THE LORD 1April2018

My dear friends,

The angel said to the women, "You are looking for Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified: he has risen, he is not here" (Mk 16:1-7). In mourning, people naturally go to the grave of a loved one. The women friends of Jesus did just that early on Easter Sunday morning. They expected to find his body and carry out the Jewish burial rites, which could not be completed before the start of the Sabbath day. Instead, they find an angel who told them, "He is not here, he is risen from the dead" and going before them into Galilee. We then have the lovely story of Jesus walking with his disciples from Jerusalem to Emmaus on Easter Sunday evening, "but something prevented them from recognising him". When they were at table with him, Jesus did what he did at the Last Supper, Breaking the Bread; and "their eyes were opened and they recognised him in the Breaking of the Bread".

We might ask ourselves, "What am I looking for?" We might be looking for peace or happiness, security or material things, power or authority. St Paul, tells us to "look for the things that are in heaven, where Christ is sitting at the right hand of God" (Col 3:1-4). When we look to Christ, he will not disappoint us with broken love or a failed relationship. Since God is pure love, he will always love us and give us victory over suffering, sin and death, through the sufferings, death and resurrection of Christ. He frees us from judgement and condemnation, from sin and guilt, by sharing the new life of grace with us, through his beloved Son,the Risen Christ, our Saviour, who sacrificed his life out of love for us. He gives us the hope of eternal happiness in heaven, where we will see God face to face, and share the joy of his saints and holy ones, in the glory of his kingdom.

I thank everyone who took part in the Lenten exercises and devotions, especially the Holy Week Services, in our parish. Nowadays it is a real challenge to keep up the practice of our faith, with many distractions and competing things to draw us away from the Lord. I encourage parents to show commitment to the practice of their faith, for the good of their children. When we honour the risen Christ as our Saviour, he honours us and all who make sacrifices to stay faithful to him. *May the Risen Christ bless you, your families and visitors this Easter. Fr John*
